

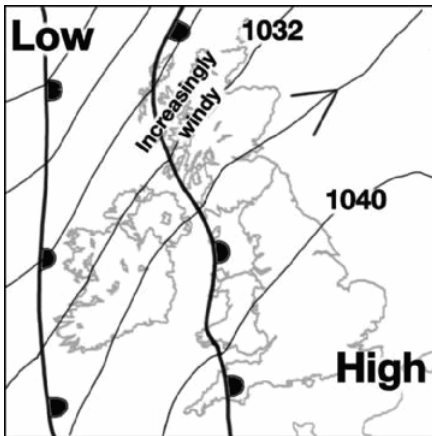
Peak District

General Summary for Sunday, 12 January, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 12 January, 2025

A change beginning as Atlantic air percolates very slowly inland. However, most terrain will be frozen and in some areas will become increasing icy. Although widely fairly light wind, will slowly strengthen, but approach gale force in upland NW Scotland.

Headline for Peak District

Terrain substantially frozen. Extensive fog.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 12 January, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly, strengthening slowly through day; around midday 10 to on higher tops 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Small or negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Precipitation unlikely
Cloud on the hills?	Some variation, but generally extensive on higher areas Confidence low: In places fog valleys or just above valleys. More widely fog extensive above 500 or 600m - but some summits may remain cloud free.
Chance of cloud free summits?	60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly cloudy and murky.
Temperature (at 600m)	Will vary between 0 and -2C. Overall will tend to rise through day. Little temperature change with height.
And in the valleys	-3 to -6C at dawn with terrain frozen. By afternoon close to or just above freezing point.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Monday 13 January	Tuesday 14 January
How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 30 to locally 45mph.	Westerly; 20, or perhaps 30mph on higher areas.
Effect of wind on you?	Arduous or in some areas difficult walking conditions over higher terrain. Considerable wind chill.	Mostly fairly small, but marked wind chill and in places walking impeded by the wind on higher areas.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Little or no rain Risk occasional rain mostly hills near and north from the M62 later in day.	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Hills largely cloud free Patches of fog probable on both higher and lower slopes, although many hills frequently free of cloud.	May cover higher slopes Confidence low: Low cloud may at times envelop the hills, possibly forming on lower slopes. However, the cloud may break up or be confined to lower slopes with higher areas above the fog.
Chance of cloud free summits?	70%	40%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patches of sunshine. Visibility good but hazy.	Sunshine may come through, possibly extensively. Good visibility - perhaps in places above fog on lower slopes.
Temperature (at 600m)	5C, small change with height. In the wind, feeling as cold as -5C.	4 to 6C.
And in the valleys	Around or just below freezing point at dawn; will rise to between 3 and 5C by afternoon, although terrain still partly	There may be slight frost valleys after dawn, before rising to 5 and 8C.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 13 January, 2025**

Thaw of most lying snow through the coming week as very mild air persistently arrives from off the Atlantic. Winds often fairly light Wales, but windier progressively northwards with frequent upland gales Scottish Highlands. Drizzle and rain now and again, but apart from in W Scotland (mainly NW Highlands) total rainfall will be small.
