

General Summary for Sunday, 23 March, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 23 March, 2025

Chilly north to northeasterly winds; air temperature near freezing on higher Scottish tops. Rain and mountain top snow in eastern Highlands gradually fading, but low cloud persists. Sunnier skies emerging in western Scotland. England & Wales sees patchy rain, drizzle and low cloud, local showers toward south.

Headline for Peak District

Chilly wind. Drizzly rain, chance showers, low cloud rising slowly.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 23 March, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Northeasterly 20 to 25mph.		
Effect of wind on you?	Affecting ease of walking on higher areas; marked wind chill.		
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Drizzly rain slowly fading, risk a shower Patchy light rain or drizzle from before dawn into the morning, amounts fairly small, but may stay damp for several hours. Tending to fade into afternoon, although risk localised showers forming.		
Cloud on the hills?	Covering hills, rising slowly Extensive cloud across the hills from dawn. Generally cloud base rising through day; by early or mid afternoon, most cloud above 450m, or 600m western hills.		
Chance of cloud free summits?	10% rising to 50% in afternoon		
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly cloudy, some brighter skies in west by afternoon. Good visibility below cloud, but generally dull.		
Temperature (at 600m)	6C. Wind chill feeling like -2C.		
And in the valleys	7C rising to 9 to 11C, highest in west.

Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Monday 24 March	Tuesday 25 March
How windy? (On the summits)	Northerly 20mph from dawn, easing into middle of day to 15mph or less; turning westerly afternoon, by dusk 20-25mph.	Northwesterly 20 to 25mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small	Fairly small, but feeling blustery and cool where exposed around higher tops.
How wet?	Rain very unlikely	A little rain in morning
(Precipitation and its impact)	Risk pockets of drizzle more eastern hills early morning.	Patchy rain and drizzle from before dawn into the early morning, mainly western hills, clearing southwards to become generally dry into afternoon, possibly sooner.
Cloud on the hills?	Early low cloud all clearing	Covering hills for a few hours, clearing
	Fog across some hills early morning, particularly eastern moors above 300m. Will all thin and break up by middle of day.	Shrouding higher moors from dawn, above 400-500m western areas, higher cloud base eastwards. Lifting above the hills into afternoon.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Rising above 90%	20% rising to 80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun developing after a dull start at least in the east. Excellent visibility by afternoon.	Cloudy morning, sun breaking through in afternoon, later increasingly sunny. Visibility reduced in rain, then very good.
Temperature (at 600m)	3C rising to 6C.	5 to 8C. Wind chill feeling close to freezing.
And in the valleys	Slight frost sheltered valleys at dawn. Reaching 10 to 12C by early afternoon.	7C from dawn, rising to 13C afternoon.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 24 March, 2025

A mixed westerly regime for the next week to ten days - fronts coming in from the west bringing spells of rain, interspersed with better days under ridges of high pressure. Rain most frequent in western Scotland. Wind speeds varied, but at times reaching gale force over the mountains. Temperature varied, occasionally just below freezing on higher Scottish summits, with some showers with snow at times on the Munros - possibly chillier for a few days around next weekend (29-30 March).

Forecast issued at 16:25 on Saturday, 22 March, 2025
