

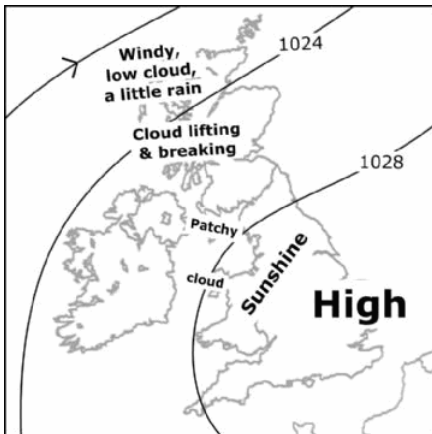
# Peak District

## General Summary for Monday, 31 March, 2025



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 31 March, 2025

Southwesterly winds strongest northwest Scotland. Low cloud covering western Scottish mountains, a little rain in the morning mainly near Skye. Cloud tending to thin and break with time. Clearer in eastern Highlands. England & Wales dry with sunshine, patchy coastal cloud in morning.

### Headline for Peak District

Dry and sunny, mostly light wind.

## Detailed Forecast for Monday, 31 March, 2025

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	West to northwesterly 10 to 15mph in morning, becoming variable 10mph or less.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Small
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Little if any</b> Chance of local patchy cloud on some western slopes from dawn, soon clearing.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Above 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny. Very good visibility.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	8C rising to 10C afternoon.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	2C at dawn, slight frost in sheltered spots, rising to 16C in the afternoon.

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	East to southeasterly 20mph, gusty 25mph around some higher tops and near edges. <b>Feeling breezy and cool on exposed terrain, gusts in places may briefly make walking uncomfortable.</b>	Easterly 20-25mph. Gusty in places, particularly western slopes. <b>Fairly small, but feeling cool in exposure to the wind.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>No precipitation expected</b>	<b>No precipitation expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Hills clear</b>	<b>Little or no cloud</b>  Some mist in a few valleys in the morning, briefly lifting onto some hill slopes, clearing for a cloud free day.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Above 90%</b>	<b>Above 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly and some thin high cloud, patchy fair-weather cloud for a time. Good visibility; possible slight haze.	Extensive sunshine. Visibility excellent.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>  <b>And in the valleys</b>	6C rising to 8 or 9C by early afternoon. In the wind feeling close to freezing at least in the morning.  3C in sheltered valleys at dawn, rising to 13 to 15C afternoon, warmest in west.	6C rising to 10C. Feeling like 1 to 4C in the wind.  Around 2C, local frost in shelter at dawn. Rising to 15C afternoon.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 1 April, 2025**

High pressure builds from the south to become centred toward the east and north onward through weekend and possibly early next week too. Extensively dry and warm with strong sunshine; local misty mornings with chilly starts in valleys, slight frost where sheltered. East to southeasterly winds prevail through mid-late week, strong and gusty for Wales and western hills elsewhere for periods.
