




The southernmost Pennines, covering the entire Peak District National Park, also extending north to hills accessed from Hebden Bridge, and including the hills immediately north of Manchester.

General Summary for Friday, 25 April, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 25 April, 2025

Most mountain areas becoming fine and warm as patches of early morning low cloud disperse. However, a front approaching western Scotland will bring strengthening wind, thickening cloud and then rain to more western mountains.

Headline for Peak District

Fairly light wind. Extensive sunshine by late morning.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 25 April, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 15 to perhaps 20mph.	
Effect of wind on you?	Small	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected	
Cloud on the hills?	All clearing by mid or late morning	
	Fog above 400m from dawn will through morning disperse - very little if any left by mid or late morning.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost certain by late morning.	
Sunshine?	Soon extensive sunshine.	
Air clarity (below cloud)	Visibility very good, but slight haze.	
Temperature (at 600m)	7C rising slowly - reaching 10C western summits.	
And in the valleys	Will reach 13 to perhaps 15C western dales in the afternoon.	

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Peak District - Looking Ahead

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 10 to perhaps 15mph.	South to southwesterly, 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain now and again Rain and drizzle occasionally - possibly heavy bursts afternoon, although generally total rainfall small.	Rain unlikely
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive on higher areas, particularly morning Cloud base generally 500 to 700m morning, although temporarily lower in rain. There will be a trend toward higher bases through the day when breaks above the summits very likely.	All clearing Fog may be widespread in some areas from lower slopes up after dawn. Will all clear during morning.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20% rising to 70%	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sun. Misty in rain, but otherwise visibility mostly excellent.	Periods of sunshine. Good visibility but a haze.
Temperature (at 600m)	5C	10C.
And in the valleys	Around 12C	13C some western dales to 16C elsewhere.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 26 April, 2025

The remnants of fronts will bring patches of rain and low cloud to most mountain areas on Saturday before tending to become confined to Scotland on Sunday (when the exact detail as yet uncertain). The rain may linger across NW Scotland into Monday before very warm dry air extends north across all mountains.
