



General Summary for Wednesday, 14 May, 2025



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 14 May, 2025

Misty low cloud in central and east Scotland in the morning; high terrain above the cloud layer. Morning low cloud east of the Pennines as well, most tops shrouded. Cloud fading to strong warm sun nearly all mountains by afternoon. Notable gusts, increasing into evening along the Pennines. Cloud-free in western areas and Wales.

Headline for Peak District

Sea fog east, dispersing; gusty winds into evening

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 14 May, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	East to northeasterly 15-20mph. Notable gusts over high tops and downslope in the west, up to 25mph. Some increase in northernmost areas as night falls, gusts up to 30mph.	
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small most of the day, some uncomfortable gusts. Gusts pick up towards evening, some buffeting and stability challenges may occur.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain	
Cloud on the hills?	Misty low cloud east and over tops early, soon all clearing	
	Patches of misty low cloud drift over some east slopes and up to tops in the early morning. Areas north of M62 may see more frequent patches. Soon lifting and breaking to clear all terrain by late morning.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	60% east at first, rising above 90%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Often strong sunshine, though some high cloud around will weaken sun at times. Visibility excellent; slight haze lower down in the morning.	
Temperature (at 600m)	7C from dawn (small change with height); reaching 11 to 13C afternoon, always coolest in the east.	
And in the valleys	5C at dawn, locally cooler in sheltered spots; rising to 17 to 19C by afternoon, warmest in west.	

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Peak District - Looking Ahead

	Thursday 15 May	Friday 16 May
How windy? (On the summits)	Northeasterly 15 to 20mph, in places gusty 25mph. Some sudden strong gusts in early morning hours.	Northeasterly 20-30mph, strong gusts in the morning. Increasing later afternoon with gusts returning, up to 40mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, but may affect comfortable walking at times near exposed edges, feeling rather cool.	Walking becoming impeded, possibly strenuous with buffeting from late afternoon on. Considerable wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain	No rain
Cloud on the hills?	Largely clear	Eastern morning fog soon fades
	Patchy cloud may graze higher moors for time in the morning, mostly eastern areas, but soon dispersing or lifting above the hills.	Patchy morning fog on eastern slopes and over high terrain. Soon fading to cloud-free hills.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	Soon above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Broken cloud and sun best in west. Eastern areas cloudier for periods, but sun breaking through especially afternoon. Visibility excellent, but dull for a time east.	Cloudy in the east in the morning, sunny west, soon becoming extensively sunny. Visibility becoming excellent.
Temperature (at 600m)	6C up to 12C afternoon, but feeling nearer to 5C in the breeze, and closer to freezing early and late in day.	8C rising to 12C. Areas east of high terrain seeing little change. Feeling near freezing in strongest wind.
And in the valleys	4C at dawn, rising to 16 to 18C afternoon, warmest western valleys.	4C rising to 19C. Local areas on western slopes rising up to 21C.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 15 May, 2025

High pressure persists north of Britain this week into the weekend bringing dry, warm and sunny weather. East to northeasterly winds prevail, at times strong and gusty, mainly England and Wales. Some coastal fog and low cloud drifting inland from the North Sea will affect eastern areas in the mornings (high terrain in Scotland often above the cloud layer), largely dispersing through middle of daytimes. Highest temperatures typically toward the west. Very dry ground conditions, beware high risk of fire.

Forecast issued at 15:22 on Tuesday, 13 May, 2025
