


Peak District

General Summary for Friday, 6 March, 2026



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 6 March, 2026

A dry and sunny day for the Highlands and Galloway with early mist banks dispersing. Southerly winds strengthening in northwest later. England and Wales: Colder; patchy precipitation, snow to lower slopes N England, eases into afternoon, but still with extensive low cloud over hills, clearer breaks forming west coast.

Headline for Peak District

Much colder feel. Patchy rain fading, but leaving extensive hill fog much of day.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 6 March, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Northeasterly 10-15mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Patchy light precipitation, most early Patchy rain, perhaps sleet over tops, from before dawn and into the morning. Dry periods likely, precipitation trending lighter, though may also return for periods.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive From dawn, extensive cloud banks at most elevations. Through day, slow rise in cloud level to around mostly 500m and up, higher bases to the southwest, but summits may struggle to clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast. Rather misty and murky across the hills.
Temperature (at 600m)	1 or 2C.
And in the valleys	4C from dawn, rising to 5 or 6C.

Chance of cloud free summits?	80%	70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Cloud breaking to give occasional sun. Visibility good, possible slight haze.	Patchy sun. Dense haze.
Temperature (at 600m)	5C, up to 7C afternoon.	7C
And in the valleys	4C at dawn, rising to 11C afternoon.	Lifting to 10C

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 7 March, 2026**

More cloud by Sunday as weak fronts encroach in from the west, some drizzly rain moving into parts of Scotland, hazy elsewhere. Patchy rain likely in the west at least early in the new week, likely dropping back just below freezing on the Munros for a time with some snowfall on higher areas. Winds fairly light early week, then a risk of strengthening southwesterly later in the week; changeable weather conditions with spells of rain coming in from the Atlantic. Remaining old snow cover on Scottish mountains stays largely consolidated with little change, only very patchy snow remains around highest tops in England and Wales.
