


# Peak District

## General Summary for Saturday, 7 March, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 7 March, 2026**

Another dry and mostly sunny day across the Scottish mountains, but patchy cloud capping some western tops at times; strong southerly wind for northwest Highlands, gale force gusts Skye. England and Wales: Sunny for Lakes and N Pennines, but low cloud much of Wales, and capping Peak District, a little light rain.

### Headline for Peak District

Mostly cloudy with tops perhaps covered for periods. Risk of spots of light rain.

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 7 March, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southeasterly 10-15mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Small.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Risk of a little light rain edging in</b> Dry through morning, but risk of a little patchy rain, mainly just spots, edging up from the south.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>May well cap hills for periods</b> Some patches of cloud may well cap the hills for periods through the day, with even some ribbons of mist in valleys at first.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>60%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive cloud cover, limiting the sun to glimpses, mainly early on. Visibility good, but still with slight haze.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	Up to 5C
<b>And in the valleys</b>	4C at dawn, rising to 11C afternoon.

<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Small</b>	<b>Small</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Mostly dry</b>	<b>Often dry</b> Often dry, but spots of light rain may at times feed in across the hills, mainly through the second half of the day.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>May well be clear</b>  Hills may well be clear.	<b>Mostly above hills</b>  Hills may be often clear of cloud, but risk of patches developing of the tops, especially through the second half of the afternoon.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>70%</b>	<b>60%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy sun. Dense haze.	Broken cloud allowing a little patchy sun.  Marked haze.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	7C	6C
<b>And in the valleys</b>	Lifting to 10C	Lifting up to 11C

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 8 March, 2026**

More cloud by Sunday as weak fronts encroach in from the west, some drizzly rain moving into mainly western parts, hazy elsewhere; dense across southern areas. Patchy rain likely in the west at least early in the new week, likely dropping back just below freezing on the Munros for a time with some snowfall on higher areas. Winds fairly light early week, then a risk of strengthening southwesterly later in the week; changeable weather conditions with spells of rain coming in from the Atlantic. Remaining old snow cover on Scottish mountains stays largely consolidated with little change, only very patchy snow remains around highest tops in England and Wales.
