

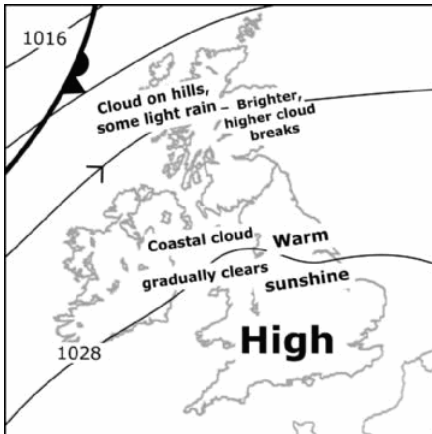
# Peak District

## General Summary for Saturday, 23 May, 2026



### British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 23 May, 2026

Scotland: Gusty south-westerly will feed extensive low cloud and patchy drizzle into the west. Mostly dry for eastern hills where cloud will lift and break off the hills.

England and Wales: Low cloud and local drizzle morning western hills, mainly coasts, but burning off to leave warm sunshine widely.

### Headline for Peak District

Early low cloud or mist disperses. Then sunny and increasingly warm. Light winds.

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 23 May, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwesterly 15mph and often less.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Mostly small.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>No rain expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Any early cloud clears entirely</b> Scattered cloud banks from dawn, mostly west slopes towards the north, perhaps a light mist in sheltered valleys. Any cloud lifts and breaks up for clear hills by late morning.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Almost certain</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Mostly sunny, some thin high cloud around. Very good visibility.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	10C rising to 16C. Minimal drop into night.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	12C at dawn, rising to 22C.

<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Nil</b>  Clear all day.	<b>Hills clear</b>  Any early patches of mist will quickly disperse.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Almost certain.</b>	<b>Almost certain</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Widely sunny.  Visibility very good.	Widespread and strong sunshine.  Good visibility, but slight haze.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	Lifting to 18 or 19C, very warm	20C, humid
<b>And in the valleys</b>	Valley temperatures lifting to 24 to 27C, highest for eastern and southern valleys.	Increasingly hot with valley temperatures reaching 26 to 28C.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 24 May, 2026**

Pressure builds this weekend, centred over England and Wales where it will be warm and sunny. To the north of the high, a blustery and gusty south-westerly will persist across the Highlands with patchy rain and hill fog, mainly in the west and northwest. Very warm by Sunday and Monday valleys of Wales and England, mid to high 20s. Low 20s glens into southern and eastern Scotland. Next week, high pressure extends over Scotland, cutting of the low cloud and drizzle from northwest Scotland by midweek with warm sunny weather, cooler in the north and east coast. Still very warm into the valleys of England and Wales with extensive sunshine.
