

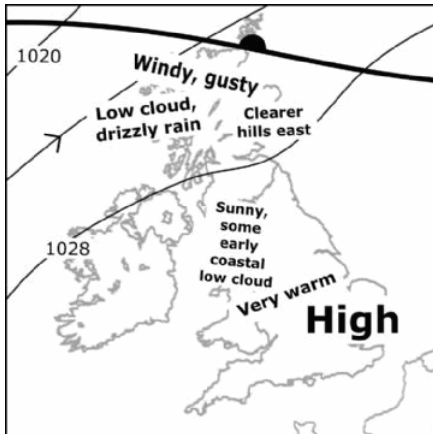
# Peak District

## General Summary for Sunday, 24 May, 2026



### British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 24 May, 2026

High pressure bringing dry and warm conditions to England and Wales and southern and eastern Scotland with early patchy hill fog in the west dispersing. Warm or very warm in valleys, beware of sunburn and dehydration. Blustery south-westerly will feed of low cloud and patchy drizzle will persist across northwest Scotland.

### Headline for Peak District

A dry and increasingly very warm day with extensive and strong sunshine.

## Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 24 May, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	South to south-westerly 5 to 10mph
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Negligible
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	Dry
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	Nil Clear all day.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	Almost certain
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Widely sunny. Visibility very good.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	Lifting to 18 or 19C, very warm
<b>And in the valleys</b>	Valley temperatures lifting to 24 to 27C, highest for eastern and southern valleys.

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	South to south-westerly 10mph.	Varying in direction, 5-10mph; perhaps flat calm for periods.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Small</b>	<b>Negligible</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Dry</b>	<b>Substantially or completely dry</b> Very likely dry, but risk of cloud bubbling up in the afternoon to give an isolated, but should they occur, slow-moving shower.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Hills clear</b>  Any early patches of mist will quickly disperse.	<b>None expected</b>  Any ribbons of mist from dawn will soon disperse.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Almost certain</b>	<b>Greater than 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Widespread and strong sunshine.  Good visibility, but slight haze.	Widespread sunshine, but areas of cloud may bubble up in the afternoon. Visibility mostly good or very good, but slight haze.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	20C, humid	18 to 20C, humid
<b>And in the valleys</b>	Increasingly hot with valley temperatures reaching 26 to 28C.	Valley temperature rising to 24 to 27C

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 25 May, 2026**

High pressure dominates this week with early patchy low cloud, mainly coastal hills dispersing to give widespread warm or very warm sunshine, highest temperatures valleys of England and Wales; where into the high 20s Monday and Tuesday Peak District into Wales with high humidity. Chance of well scattered shower development from midweek as a gusty south-easterly develops for western hills. Pressure lowering next weekend into next week.
