

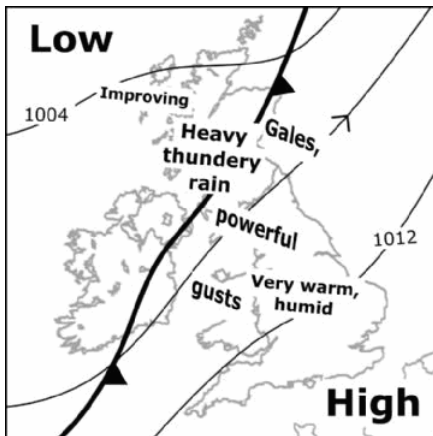
# Peak District

## General Summary for Friday, 19 June, 2026



**British Mountain Summary:  
Based on forecast chart for noon 19 June, 2026**

A swathe of heavy rain extends across the Highlands, southern Scotland then into Cumbria and west Wales, some torrential bursts, thunder and lightning possible. A belt of gale-force upland winds just ahead of the rain. Warm and humid. Winds ease in western Scotland, rain fades, cloud lifts, dropping cooler.

**Headline for Peak District**

Windy, gusty. Very warm and humid, sun and cloud.

## Detailed Forecast for Friday, 19 June, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	South-southwesterly, 20 to 35mph, speeds likely to fluctuate throughout the day, very gusty for periods around high tops and edges, particularly later ahead of rain.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Very blustery, strenuous walking in places, gusts starting to affect balance in exposure. Feeling cooler on tops despite warm air.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Possibly thundery bursts late in day</b> Dry most or all of the day. Toward evening from west, odd spots developing from high cloud, possibly an isolated burst of rain or isolated thunderstorm mainly late evening into night.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Little or none</b> Brief mist around some slopes around dawn, otherwise hills likely clear. Ragged patches late in day if rain develops.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Some strong sun, mixed with high cloud, which may thicken across the sky, mainly late in day. Visibility very good, some haze develops.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	Humid 15 to 17C, then into night dropping to 12C. Feeling nearer 5C directly in wind all day.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	14C at dawn, rising to 25C afternoon, feeling very humid.

## Peak District - Looking Ahead

	<b>Saturday 20 June</b>	<b>Sunday 21 June</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwesterly 15mph, tending to drop less during afternoon.	East to southeasterly or variable, often 10mph or less, occasional gusts 15-20mph may develop.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Mostly small.</b>	<b>Small.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Little or no rain</b> Chance of an odd light shower mainly western areas in the morning, but most of the day likely dry.	<b>Rain unlikely</b> Chance of odd spots from thickening high cloud, possibly an isolated brief burst of rain in afternoon.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Soon all clear</b>  Some patchy cloud banks on western hills in morning, mainly areas north of M62. All dispersing during morning.	<b>Hills clear</b>
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>90%</b>	<b>Above 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Mix of high cloud and sun. Visibility very good.	A mix of sun and some high cloud, which may cover the sky for periods. Visibility very good, some haze develops.
<b>Temperature (at 600m)</b>	10C rising to 14C afternoon.	15C at dawn, rising to 20C afternoon.
<b>And in the valleys</b>	14C at dawn, rising to 20C afternoon.	13C at dawn, rising to 25C afternoon, increasingly humid.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 20 June, 2026**

Cooler and less humid for Saturday, some showery rain and low cloud in the west, tending to improve. Sunday is a dry day for most with clearer hills, light winds and feeling warmer, becoming more humid again from the south. More uncertainty early next week - some rain possible for Scotland into Monday, potential scattered thunderstorms for England and Wales as it becomes very humid. A fresher westerly wind is indicated into Tuesday with some showers, then higher pressure likely expands over the country from the south midweek with drier weather then likely for a few days. Scope for higher temperatures and humidity to build toward next weekend, which may eventually break into thunderstorms.
