

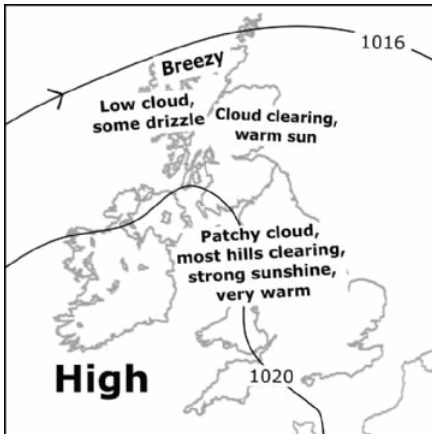
Peak District

General Summary for Wednesday, 8 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 8 July, 2026

Damp with blanket low cloud in W-NW Scotland, gusty locally. Highest Scottish tops may emerge above the cloud. Drizzle on western slopes easing, cloud thinning and breaking for central and southwest Scotland, sunnier and warmer overall in east. Very warm to hot sunshine for England & Wales.

Headline for Peak District

Very warm and sunny. Fairly light wind.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 8 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	West to southwesterly 10 to 15mph, often lower speeds toward south; in places gusts 20mph higher tops for an hour or so from dawn.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Generally clear Any early patchy mist in valleys or some hill slopes soon dispersing.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine and thin fair-weather cloud; high UV, beware sunburn. Visibility very good.
Temperature (at 600m)	15C rising to 20 to 22C afternoon, warmest south and eastern moors.
And in the valleys	15C at dawn, rising to 25 to 28C afternoon, warmest southern areas.

How windy? (On the summits)	Variable direction 5 to 10mph.	East to southeasterly or variable 10 to 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Most likely dry Late in the day, small chance of a very isolated burst of rain.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear	Hills clear
Chance of cloud free summits?	Practically certain	Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Generally sunny, thin high cloud. Visibility very good, distant slight haze.	Strong sunshine, some thin high cloud. Rather hazy views likely.
Temperature (at 600m)	17C rising to 23C afternoon.	17C at dawn rising to 25C; very warm but not so humid.
And in the valleys	15C at dawn, rising to 27C afternoon.	15C at dawn, rising toward 30C afternoon.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 9 July, 2026**

Increasingly warm for Scotland, hot for England and Wales this week. Southwesterly winds easing for much of Scotland but remnants of fronts bring further low cloud and drizzle to the west late this week. Locally a chance of thundery downpours in eastern Highlands later Friday, some of which may linger into Saturday but likely fading. A generally fine summertime outlook through the weekend and well into next week as high pressure expands northwards to broadly reside across Britain. Warm but generally pleasant summer temperatures next week. Sunshine and fair-weather cloud, many hills often clear. Easterly breezes for England and Wales.
