

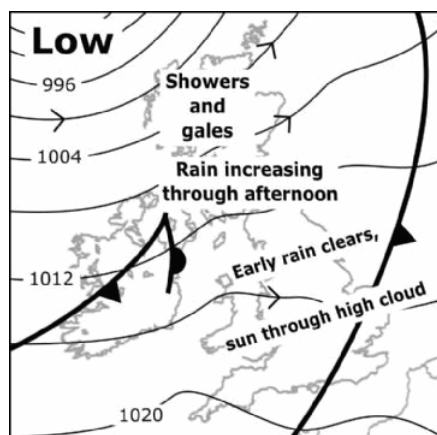
Peak District

General Summary for Monday, 7 September, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 7 September, 2026

Showers in west Scotland from dawn, spreading east. Gales across the highlands, severe northwest, feeling cold. Early rain in England and Wales breaks for sun through high cloud, windy in the north. Prolonged rain arrives into south Scotland from midday, spreading into north England with time, and later Wales.

Headline for Peak District

Early rain breaks for a dry day with weak sun; becoming breezy

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 7 September, 2026

How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Southwesterly 20 to 25mph, tending to rise afternoon, and may suddenly approach up to 35mph over high tops later, or stronger into evening. May be quite blustery just at and before dawn too. May be fairly small much of the day, but a strengthening breeze will impact ease of walking, to perhaps more strenuous conditions into evening.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Mostly dry, a little early and late rain Showery rain just around dawn and for a few hours, soon easy and breaking up for a largely dry day. A few light patches of rain return later, becoming more frequent into evening/night, setting in overnight for several hours.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Covering hills early morning, lifting to clear the summits Varied cloud over the hills during early rain above 500-600m, some lower patches in west. Tending to lift and break through morning, likely clear from midday onward. 30% at dawn, rising to 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun breaking through, may be fairly extensive afternoon but weakened by high cloud. Very good visibility, a little haze.
Temperature (at 600m) And in the valleys	11 or 12C, may rise a degree southernmost Pennines. Feeling just above freezing in strongest wind over the summits. Mild 14C at dawn, then only small rise to max 17C; cooling notably into nighttime.

	Tuesday 8 September	Wednesday 9 September
How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 35-45mph, trending westerly with time with stronger sustained speeds.	Northwesterly 30-35mph to start, gradually easing, around 20mph afternoon, shifting westerly and further easing.
Effect of wind on you?	Strenuous-to-arduous walking in exposure most of the day, gusts challenging stability; considerable wind chill.	Blustery in exposure to start and feeling chilly, gradually easing, to small effects later.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Scattered showers, increasing Scattered showers drift onto the hills from the west, gradually increasing in frequency, some extended falls forming later but breaking back to showers too.	Little or none Small chance a few spots of light rain, mostly towards the south, but may be entirely dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Largely clear tops well into the day Varied cloud above middle slopes in the early morning will lift to clear the summits well into the day. As showers become more frequent, patches start to lower onto the summits in and after rain.	Mostly early, clearing Patchy cloud mostly around high edges in the morning, variable and tending to lift though may linger for slightly longer around Kinder Scout, but ultimately lifting for clear moors through afternoon.
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%	Rising to 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Bursts of sunshine. Visibility generally good but a haze, particularly western areas.	Becoming mostly sunny, some fair weather cloud around. Good visibility.
Temperature (at 600m) And in the valleys	7 or 8C rising up to 10C, though will vary around showers. Feeling around freezing in direct wind. 9C at dawn, rising to 14 or 15C, though will vary a few degrees around showers, and later trend cooler.	8C rising to 11 or 12C. Feeling just above freezing to start, wind chill effect easing. 9C at dawn, rising to 16C.

All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 8 September, 2026

An unsettled weekend is indicated, followed by a rising chance of longer settled windows from mid-month, particularly England and Wales. Temperatures will be generally near or above average. best sunny windows east hill groups.
