


Snowdonia National Park

General Summary for Tuesday, 25 October, 2022



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 25 October, 2022

Despite a weak ridge of high pressure, with humid air coming in from the south, most mountain areas will remain foggy with pockets of drizzle, most widely on the western and central highlands in morning. Late in day strengthening wind and rain will spread north across Wales.

Headline for Snowdonia National Park

Fairly light wind until late in day. Extensive fog higher areas, but cloud base rising.

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 25 October, 2022

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwest soon backing southerly, 20 to on higher tops west Wales 25mph. Will begin to strengthen toward 30 or 35mph toward dusk.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly fairly small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain and drizzle occasionally westernmost hills, extensively dry elsewhere A few patches rain and drizzle at first western dales before becoming dry. However, threat persistent rain toward dusk.
Cloud on the hills?	Initially blanket of very low cloud. Cloud base rising, most quickly E Wales Fog widespread lower slopes up from dawn, particularly west Wales. Will improve, by midday in east Wales, nearly all cloud above 800m, and may increasingly clear highest tops. In west Wales, cloud base rising more slowly to reach 800m, possibly higher by mid afternoon.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost nil rising by early afternoon to 20% west Wales and 70% east
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patches of sun, mainly east Wales. Haze lifting to give very good or in east Wales perhaps excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits

Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Wednesday 26 October	Thursday 27 October
How windy? (On the summits)	Between south and southwesterly around 40mph, but 50-55mph highest western summits.	Between south and southwest, 30 to 35mph; strongest higher western summits.
Effect of wind on you?	Upland gales will make for very difficult walking conditions and significant wind chill on higher areas.	Arduous walking where exposed on higher areas, particularly higher tops Snowdon range.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Showery rain on and off, mainly west Showery. The rain sometimes very frequent for an hour or two. In east Wales, frequently dry; drizzly showers occasionally.	Occasional rain One or two pulses of rain, perhaps lasting an hour or so, although drizzly rain more extensive across from Snowdon to Lleyn peninsula.
Cloud on the hills?	Very extensive; lowest cloud western mountains Persistent fog nearly all higher areas, although cloud base will tend to lift a little. By late morning, typically cloud above 400 to perhaps later 600m, but much lower Snowdon to Lleyn peninsula. Highest base Carneddau & north from Berwyn mountains: 600 to later 800m.	Persistent across higher areas Persistent fog across most or all higher areas. For periods cloud below 300m Snowdon to Lleyn peninsula. Cloud base typically 450 to 650m elsewhere, although perhaps occasionally 750m Carneddau and east Wales.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%	10%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Generally cloudy or dull and very hazy (particularly near west coast) although a little sun lower areas near Carneddau and east Wales.	Extensively dull and misty.
How Cold? (at 900m)	9C	9C
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 26 October, 2022**

The present weather pattern will continue all week: Winds speeds varying; but often windy with one or two periods of upland gales. Rain at some stage more or less daily, sometimes heavy and persistent. Cloud rarely clearing higher areas, giving persistent fog, although the odd day when at least cloud lifts off lower slopes. Temperatures continuing well above freezing point, even on highest summits.
