



General Summary for Friday, 11 November, 2022



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 11 November, 2022

Scotland: Storm-force, or over the tops, Hurricane force southwest winds. Extensive hill fog, highest bases in northeast, with rain and drizzle; incessant and heavy Skye, Wester Ross, Lochaber.

England and Wales: Widespread southwest gales with extensive hill fog and persistent drizzle in the west. Drier Peak District.

Headline for Snowdonia National Park

Widespread gales with drizzly rain on and off, and extensive hill fog.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 11 November, 2022

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 40 to 60mph. Tending to see speeds drop off later in the day.
Effect of wind on you?	Difficult conditions, general mobility very challenging at times. Strong gusts may blow you over. Significant wind chill.
How wet?	Drizzly rain on and off Small amounts in total, but expect drizzle or light rain, perhaps persistent, for a few hours Snowdon range westwards. Spots in the wind well inland, mostly dry furthest east.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive Cloud shrouding hills from lowest slopes, particularly coasts, widely from mid-slopes up Snowdon range. Higher cloud bases Carneddau and the Berwyn range, occasional breaks toward summits.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Little or no sunshine, glimpses toward northeast Wales. Very hazy.
How Cold? (at 900m)	8C. Feeling around -6C in the wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits

How windy? (On the summits)	Southeasterly, 20 to 35mph; varied and very gusty, especially west of Snowdon, strongest winds not necessarily on	Southerly 25 to 40mph, varied and very gusty. Strongest winds not necessarily on highest slopes. Some lulls.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small some areas, but expect local buffeting gusts down to lower slopes and through passes.	Varied. Be prepared sudden, at times frequent, strong gusts, then marked lulls where pockets of little wind.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Early valley fog clearing Fog banks in valleys from dawn, the mountains likely clear above an inversion. May briefly drift onto lower slopes, mainly east Wales, but will all thin and break up during morning.	Mostly clear, some lower slopes in fog. Varied conditions: Areas of low cloud affecting some lower slopes; mainly in the south and east, where some patches will persist. Hills widely clear above.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	80% (above areas of low level cloud)
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Misty start in valleys, but clearing to leave mostly sunny skies. Visibility excellent on mountains, perhaps low level haze.	Sunny above low level cloud, and to lower slopes where cloud clears. Foggy some lower slopes, but excellent visibility higher slopes.
How Cold? (at 900m)	9C or locally warmer some northern slopes. Feeling cooler where exposed to wind.	12C, little change in temperature with height.
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Above the summits

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 12 November, 2022**

Very mild southerly winds prevail. On Saturday, the legacy of Thursday and Friday's front will push back north over Scotland with low cloud and drizzly rain, gradually fading with mostly dry conditions on Sunday. Inversion conditions will develop over England and Wales for the weekend, leaving tops increasingly clear above early fog banks. However, gusty winds will strengthen again on Sunday, especially in the west. Next week stays unsettled, potentially stormy at times. Frequent heavy rain and showers. Dropping near or below freezing on higher mountains, so intermittent snow and hail is likely on highest tops.
