

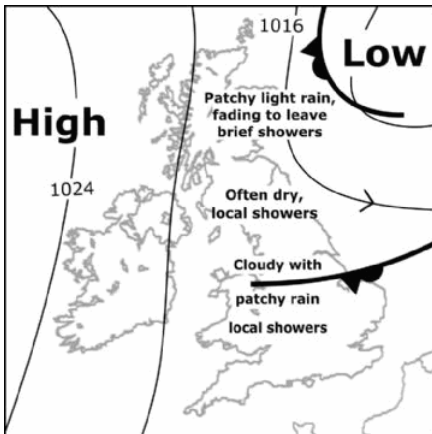
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

## General Summary for Thursday, 11 July, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 11 July, 2024

Extensive cloud, more frequent rain in the morning on Snowdon range and in the Cairngorms. Sunny spells likeliest on the western Scottish coast. where cloud may lift during the day above most hills, leaving highest Munros in clouds. Windy on the eastern Highlands. Mostly cool temperatures.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Mostly cloudy, locally showers particularly northward

## Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 11 July, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Variable 15mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Fairly small.
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Showers mostly confined to Snowdon range morning</b> Light, showery rain on and off morning northern coast and Snowdon range. Elsewhere showers developing mainly from about midday.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive fog morning; cloud base gradually rising</b> Extensively foggy start, cloud on many lower slopes Snowdon range in particular. Will slowly improve as cloud base rises toward 750m, perhaps later above 900m, particularly away from Snowdon range.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>10% rising to 50%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly cloudy only occasional sun. Visibility excellent.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	6 or 7C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Northerly, 10 to 20mph, occasionally 25mph Snowdon/Yr Wyddfa range.	Northwesterly 15 to 20mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Mostly small effect on walking, but feeling distinctly chilly for July on higher summits.</b>	<b>Small.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Local showers</b> On coastal hills in the north, light drizzly showers mainly morning. By middle of day into afternoon, local showers forming inland, drifting south into mid-Wales, chance of an odd heavier one.	<b>Brief showers. High uncertainty</b> Brief, mostly light showers over some mountains. High uncertainty for the details.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Low cloud lifting during day</b>  In the morning, varied low cloud banks, including mist in some valleys at first. Some high tops may be briefly above cloud. Most persistent on areas toward north coast. Into afternoon, cloud lifting toward or above many summits.	<b>Hills partly covered</b>  Clouds widely covering hills on the northern coast and Snowdon range. Toward south and east mostly clear.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>40% rising to 70%</b>	<b>40%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun and clouds; sunniest near coasts late afternoon.  Very good visibility.	Cloudy in the north, good few hours of sunshine toward the south.  Very good visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	6 to 8C. In the breeze, feeling near-freezing or sometimes sub-zero on highest tops.  Above the summits	9 or 10C  Above the summits

**Planning Outlook**

**All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 12 July, 2024**

Extensively dry over the next few days, although with one or two 'shallow' areas of low pressure close to Britain, rain is likely for a few hours in some areas - or sometimes afternoon heavy showers. Generally winds light; some sunshine, but overall fairly extensive cloud. A little less cold.
