

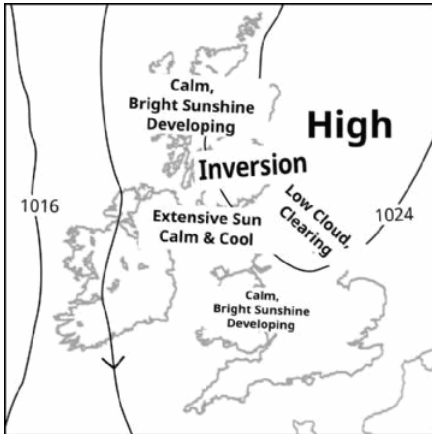

General Summary for Thursday, 3 October, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 3 October, 2024

Widely dry and sunny, inversion means often clear skies above the sea of clouds sitting in the valleys, this low cloud mostly dissipating by noon. Light winds, locally breezy along the western coast. Cool.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Dry, mostly sunny above valley fog, cool and calm

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 3 October, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Southeast to easterly mostly 10 to 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear Patches of fog in some valleys possible, hills clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Lot of sunshine with some fair weather clouds. Perhaps at times thin layer of stratified clouds hindering the sun. Visibility good but slight haze.
How Cold? (at 900m)	6 to 9C
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Friday 4 October	Saturday 5 October
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Southerly 20 to 40mph, strongest toward the west, here very gusty. Snowdon range and westwards considerable buffeting, walking strenuous, stability affected. In the east mostly small.	Toward Llyn and Yr Wyddfa/Snowdon 30 to 40mph, possible gusts of 50mph. In the east widely 20-25mph. Noticeable in the east, in the west blustery, highly affecting balance and stability. Significant wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk rain toward Llyn Around Yr Wyddfa/Snowdon and particularly west of it toward Llyn Peninsula risk of afternoon rain. Elsewhere dry.	Daytime dry Overnight rain lasting until early morning, later dry, rain again in the evening on westernmost hills.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits?	Misty in valleys, hills mostly clear Hills widely clear, perhaps morning fog in the valleys here and there. In the afternoon hills in the northwest may gradually hide in cloud. 80% falling to 40% northwest later	Locally covered but mostly clear In the morning fog patches in some valleys. Later hills likely clear, perhaps highest tops may see clouds coming and going. 60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunny start, afternoon clouds slowly filling in from the west. Good visibility but slight haze.	Patchwork of sunshine. Very good visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	6 to 9C, feeling sub-zero in wind. Above the summits.	7 to 9C. Wind chill may reduce the perceived temperature to -5C. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 4 October, 2024

On Friday in western Scotland deteriorating conditions, beware of upland gales in the Highlands. Lowering pressure and southwesterly winds toward the weekend bring an unsettled spell- rain at times, briefly milder air. Gradually cooling through next week, with spells of showery rain. On Thursday most likely widespread moderate to heavy rain, fairly persistent most mountains. Toward the weekend improving conditions, Saturday and Sunday probably dry and sunny.
