

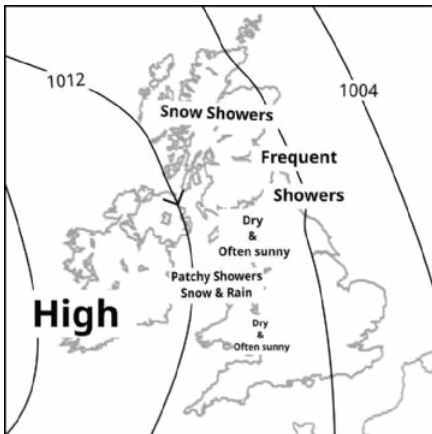
Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

General Summary for Thursday, 10 October, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 10 October, 2024

Cold, on Munros below freezing. Widespread morning frost in the valleys, in Lakes and Snowdonia below freezing in the morning. Snow showers in the Highlands. Snow and rain mix toward the Borders and locally in Snowdonia. Elsewhere likely dry, often sunny, but in places windy through eastern UK.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Mostly dry, some sunshine, risk snow showers north

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 10 October, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	North to northwesterly, 20 to 25mph, perhaps at times 30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small. Feeling notably cold in wind.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Mostly dry, brief snow shower Carneddau & Snowdon One or two brief showers, most likely toward Carneddau and Snowdon range. Snowflakes above 700-800m. Elsewhere dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Tops temporarily covered in the north Hills of Carneddau and Snowdon range covered extensively above 600-800m in the morning, later becoming clear. Toward the south most likely hills clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Intermittent sun, frequent away from highest tops near Snowdon range. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	0 to 3C, feeling much colder in wind.
Freezing Level	Above most summits, in the north down to 1000m.

Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Friday 11 October	Saturday 12 October
How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly, 5 to 15mph.	Forecast uncertainty high: Variable, 5 to 15mph or less toward the south, in the north possible speeds of 20-25mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.	Mostly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely An odd shower possible, but most likely dry.	Mostly dry until late afternoon Local showers in the north (Carneddau, Snowdon) possible but much of the day dry. Toward the evening widespread moderate rain moving in from the north.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills likely clear Locally cloud patches in the morning, soon dissipating.	Hills likely clear. Patches of low cloud here and there possible, but generally hills likely clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%	70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Frequent, patchy sunshine. Visibility excellent.	Sun fairly frequent. Very good visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	0 to 2C	3C
Freezing Level	In the morning on the level of highest tops, rising above most summits. Morning frost in valleys.	Above the summits, frost in valleys and depressions.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 11 October, 2024

Warm front passing on Friday brings briefly milder temperatures, gales and rain in western Highlands, before flow changes back to northerly for the weekend. Saturday frequently wet in Scotland, snow on the tops, rain lower down. High pressure meaning cool but sunny Sunday, still sunny on Monday but southerly winds increasingly strong on western hills. Warmer next week, any snow soon melting and probably a few dry but windy days in the start of the week. Conditions possibly deteriorating midweek.
