

General Summary for Friday, 1 November, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 1 November, 2024

Widely dull and overcast, in Highlands frequent rain, especially in the north, where windy at start. Mostly mild or warm. In England and Wales isolated spots of drizzle possible, but generally dry. Best chances for sun in northern Scotland in the afternoon, after the rain has passed.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Dry but cloudy, highest tops briefly above cloud. Light winds

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 1 November, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Westerly or variable, mostly 10 to 15mph or less.	
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Isolated spots of drizzle not fully ruled out, but generally dry.	
Cloud on the hills?	Mist in valleys, especially in the morning	
	Low cloud may be fairly widespread in the valleys and on lower hills in the morning, later lifting to higher levels. Above 600-800m frequently clear at start, deteriorating.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	50%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	At times sunny above the low cloud, but murky in the valleys. Becoming dull on all levels. Excellent visibility.	
How Cold? (at 900m)	11C	
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Cloud on the hills?	Most likely extensive, tops perhaps clear	Cloud in the valleys, clear higher up
	High uncertainty, most likely scenario: Low cloud from lower slopes upward, lifting only a little through the day. Highest tops have chance to be above the cloud.	Low cloud and fog in the valleys, from mid-slopes upward clear. Lower down cloud may persist the whole day.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30%	70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Uncertain, most likely little or no sunshine at all and poor visibility.	Plenty of sunshine and excellent visibility if above the cloud.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7 to 9C	8 to 10C, lower down much colder.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 2 November, 2024

Back to high pressure conditions for the weekend and beginning of next week. Inversion developing means often very misty or cloudy, but tops sometimes above cloud - especially the Munros. Southwesterly winds, dry and mild conditions. Such scheme holds until mid next week, when a weak front passage will probably deteriorate weather for a day, at least in Scotland. Later another few days of often cloudy, but dry and even warmer weather. Winds may speed up again end of next week.
