

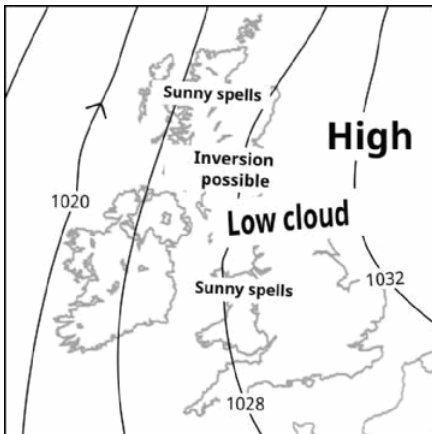

General Summary for Thursday, 7 November, 2024



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 7 November, 2024

Another widely murky day, with hills often in or just below cloud, damp with local drizzle. Windy in Highlands, some upland gales. Best chances for sun in Snowdonia, in north Lake District and in Northwest Highlands and along Strathspey. Generally mild.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Sunny spells, murky toward east. Dry with moderate breeze

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 7 November, 2024

How windy? (On the summits)	Southeasterly, 15 to perhaps locally 30mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Walking becoming strenuous, marked wind chill. Stability slightly affected on exposed ridges.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely An odd spot of drizzle or dampness east Wales.
Cloud on the hills?	Covered partly Hills partly covered, perhaps down to lowest slopes, fog in the morning possible in the valleys. Toward the west and on Snowdon range more often cloud-free. Highest tops may stay above the cloud.
Chance of cloud free summits?	60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunny spells toward the west, cloudy in east Wales. Visibility moderate, often very hazy.
How Cold? (at 900m)	Near 8C
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Marked wind chill.</p>	<p>Southerly, mostly 10-20mph, toward Llyn and Yr Wyddfa/Snowdon possibly 25mph.</p> <p>Fairly small.</p>
<p>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</p>	<p>No rain expected</p>	<p>Rain unlikely Odd spot of drizzle possible.</p>
<p>Cloud on the hills?</p> <p>Chance of cloud free summits?</p>	<p>Mostly clear, extensive in east</p> <p>Cloud covering the hills in east Wales densely, toward Snowdon possible frequent breaks or even clear hills.</p> <p>60%</p>	<p>Covered partly, best breaks north of A5</p> <p>Cloud on various levels, most likely lower slopes clear but tops and higher slopes covered. Breaks toward the north (e.g. Carneddau).</p> <p>40%</p>
<p>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Frequent sun near Snowdon range, cloudy in the east. Visibility poor in eastern areas, good north & west.</p>	<p>Some sun toward Carneddau and fairly good visibility, elsewhere mostly overcast and dull.</p>
<p>How Cold? (at 900m)</p> <p>Freezing Level</p>	<p>8C to locally 11C northernmost areas.</p> <p>Above the summits.</p>	<p>Around 9C</p> <p>Above the summits.</p>

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 8 November, 2024

Southerly flow with cloudy and damp weather continues until Sunday, when a cold front from the Atlantic will bring some rain. This passes quickly and will be followed by westerlies bringing more sun beginning of next week. From Monday onward high pressure centres over the UK, sunnier and warmer conditions with hardly any rain are expected until Thursday, when another front will bring some rain and again cooler air. Unclear for next weekend, but high pressure, dry conditions are most likely.
