

General Summary for Wednesday, 12 February, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 12 February, 2025

Below freezing across all higher terrain; brisk easterly winds giving considerable wind chill, gusty in places. Less windy southwards over England and Wales. Widely cloudy, snow flurries eastern hills, most common Pennines. Sunshine toward northwest Scotland.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Chilly, but fairly light wind. Largely dry, cloud tending to lift.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 13 February, 2025

Remaining cold with nearly all mountain terrain frozen into the weekend and beyond. An east to southeasterly weather pattern prevails. Total precipitation will be small, although one or two periods where snow showers or flurries will reach mainly eastern mountains, whilst occasionally winds strengthen and a threat of precipitation on western mountains as Atlantic fronts temporarily make progress toward western Britain.
