

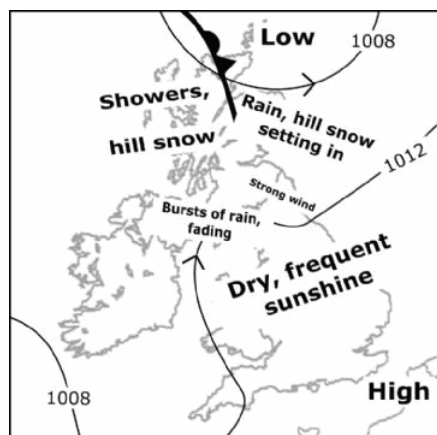
Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

General Summary for Thursday, 17 April, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 17 April, 2025

Snow setting in for a time over the Munros in Scotland, staying sub-zero on high tops. Showery in the Southern Uplands. Windy with bursts of rain in north England, fading through afternoon as cloud lifts and breaks. Mostly dry with a brisk breeze south Pennines and Wales with frequent sunshine.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Frequent sun after cloud disperses. Winds easing.

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 17 April, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	At dawn, westerly 20-30mph, soon easing to 10-15mph and beginning a southerly shift. Returning to near 20mph around dusk.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small after some uncomfortable breezes at dawn.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Substantially dry Substantially dry most of the day. Chance of brief and isolated drizzly showers in the afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Few patches over high terrain Cloud banks here and there in the morning over high terrain, soon breaking. Mountains will stay mostly clear with a few cloud caps over high tops coming and going.
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Frequently sunny for much of the day, patchy cloud building in through the afternoon. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	1C, rising to 4C
Freezing Level	Possibly just grazing the highest summits at dawn, soon lifting above.
