

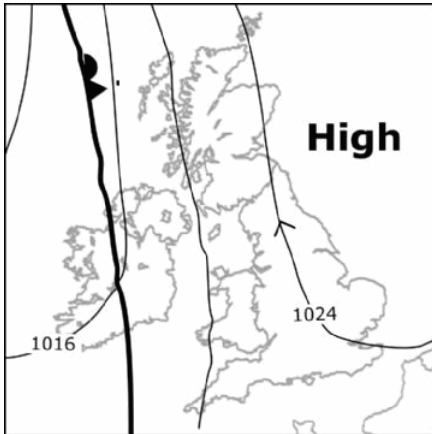
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

## General Summary for Friday, 25 April, 2025



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 25 April, 2025

Most mountain areas becoming fine and warm as patches of early morning low cloud disperse. However, a front approaching western Scotland will bring strengthening wind, thickening cloud and then rain to more western mountains.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Fairly light wind. Periods of sunshine; intermittently cloudy.

## Detailed Forecast for Friday, 25 April, 2025

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southerly typically 15 to 20mph, locally gusts to 30mph west Wales.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Mostly small; but mainly central and western hills, locally gusty both on higher and lower slopes.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Chance of the odd patch of rain late in day</b> Small risk of isolated burst of rain toward or during evening.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Coming and going on highest slopes</b> Generally areas of cloud after dawn, mostly east Wales, above 450m will lift and break, but may come and go above 750 to 900m - the higher cloud base likely in west Wales.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>70% by late morning.</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Periods of sunshine - although the sun weakening from west as high level cloud thickens. Hazy, particularly east Wales.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	4C rising slowly - reaching 7C, northern and western summits.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

## Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	<b>Saturday 26 April</b>	<b>Sunday 27 April</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southerly 10 to perhaps 15mph higher western summits.	South to southwesterly, 15 to perhaps 25mph on higher tops.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Negligible</b>	<b>Small.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain now and again, mainly morning.</b> A little rain occasionally, mainly morning.	<b>Rain unlikely</b> Small risk of a few pockets of rain and drizzle west Wales.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive on higher areas, particularly morning</b> Cloud base generally 400 to 650m morning, although tending to rise. There will be a trend toward higher bases; by afternoon, most cloud above 750m, perhaps sometimes above 900m.	<b>Mostly or all clearing</b> Fog may be widespread in some areas from lower slopes up after dawn. Will very likely all clear during morning.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>10% rising to 40%</b>	<b>70%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sun, mainly afternoon. Misty in rain, but otherwise visibility mostly excellent.	Periods of sunshine - possibly fairly cloudy NW Wales. Good visibility but a haze.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	5C	6C rising to 9C.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits	Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 26 April, 2025**

The remnants of fronts will bring patches of rain and low cloud to most mountain areas on Saturday before tending to become confined to Scotland on Sunday (when the exact detail as yet uncertain). The rain may linger across NW Scotland into Monday before very warm dry air extends north across all mountains.
