

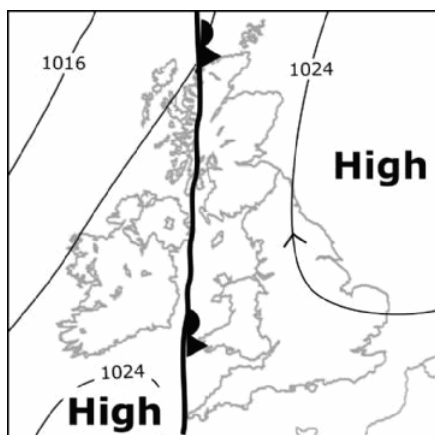

General Summary for Saturday, 26 April, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 26 April, 2025

Rain and low cloud will reach mainly western mountains ahead of a weakening front. Generally a slow improvement through the day as the rain increasingly fizzles out and away from south facing coastal hills, cloud base rises. Blustery Scottish Highlands, particularly NW.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Rain, mainly morning. Light wind.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 26 April, 2025

| How windy? (On the summits) | Southerly 10 to perhaps 15mph higher western summits. |

| How wet? (Precipitation and its impact) | Rain now and again, mainly morning. A little rain occasionally, mainly morning. |
| Cloud on the hills? | Extensive higher areas morning; cloud base tending to rise through day. Cloud base generally 400 to 650m morning, although tending to rise. There will be a trend toward higher bases; by afternoon most cloud above 750m, perhaps sometimes above 900m. |

| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Occasional sun, mainly afternoon. Misty in rain, but otherwise visibility mostly excellent. |
| How Cold? (at 900m) | 7C |
| Freezing Level | Above the summits |

| How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you? | South to southwesterly, 15mph mid Wales to 20 or 25mph lower tops N Wales, but perhaps 35mph Snowdon range. Mostly small mid Wales, but gusty wind Snowdon range may well give considerable wind chill and sudden buffeting.. | Southerly between 10mph. Negligible |
| How wet? (Precipitation and its impact) | Rain very unlikely | Rain not expected |
| Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free summits? | Mountains cloud free, but fog some lower slopes post dawn. Fog patches on lower slopes, most likely Llyn peninsula to Snowdon post dawn. Will disperse by mid, locally late morning. Greater than 90% | Little if any 90% |
| Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud) | Extensive or unbroken sunshine, but a haze, and fog some lower areas for a few hours from dawn. | Sunshine extensive and visibility excellent. |
| How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level | 6C rising to 9C. Above the summits. | 9C Above the summits |

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 27 April, 2025

Much of Britain will be fine and sunny through much of next week. Temperatures, after being very warm, could well drop markedly on Thursday (Scotland) or Friday (England and Wales). Westerly winds in N Scotland may well maintain more mixed weather here, with occasional rain and cloud across higher summits.
