

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# General Summary for Wednesday, 7 May, 2025



### British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 7 May, 2025

Fine with sunshine and patchy fair-weather cloud above the hills, may cover the sky for periods by the afternoon. Remote risk of an isolated shower forming. Mostly light winds, a freshening northeasterly for the Pennines later. Cool start, becoming pleasantly warm.

Sunshine, patchy cloud; breeze increasing later.

## Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 7 May, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	North to northeasterly 10-15mph, strongest toward Llyn, at times 20mph; more widely strengthening into evening, local gusts 25mph around high tops.		
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, but feeling chilly in the stronger breeze early and especially late in the day.		
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain		
Cloud on the hills?	Not expected		
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%		
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun and high cloud, some patchy fair-weather cloud building afternoon inland; sunniest near to west coasts. Visibility excellent.		
How Cold? (at 900m)	4C at dawn, rising as high as 9C afternoon, but in the breeze feeling much cooler - just below freezing at first, around 3C later in day.		
Freezing Level	Generally above the summits, but at dawn near freezing with slight frost both in the valleys and on sheltered higher terrain.

How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected	No rain

	Patches of cloud may graze tops mainly Carneddau area early morning, soon all lifting above the summits.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	80%	Above 90%
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunniest near west coast, some broken cloud for periods inland. Visibility excellent.	Sunshine and patchy fair-weather cloud. Visibility excellent.
How Cold? (at 900m)	3C rising to 8C afternoon. Feeling like -3C in the wind in morning.	5C rising to 11C by afternoon.
Freezing Level	Generally above the summits, but just at dawn slight frost some valleys and sheltered higher terrain.	Above the summits

## Planning Outlook

#### All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 8 May, 2025

A quiet spell of weather as high pressure continues to dominate over the British Isles this week and likely into next week too. Generally dry conditions, low risk of an isolated afternoon shower. Sunshine and variable cloud, at times covering the sky, but generally above the mountain tops with excellent visibility. Winds mostly light, direction variable. Slight frosts at dawn in sheltered spots. Becoming pleasantly warm into afternoons, generally warmer by the weekend. Possibly local bursts of rain forming Sunday into early next week, mainly Wales. Very dry ground conditions, beware high risk of fire.
