

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# General Summary for Wednesday, 30 July, 2025



# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 30 July, 2025

Generally cloudy conditions, covering some hill slopes in the morning, but breaking and lifting above many tops. Occasional sun breaking through, mainly in the east. In western Scotland, a weak front pushing in will lower the cloud over coastal hills and bring a little drizzle at times. Light winds overall.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Largely dry day, cloud lifting and breaking. Moderate breeze.

## Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 30 July, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Northwest later westerly 15 to 20mph.	
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Substantially dry Often dry, risk of odd drizzly showers. By evening into night, steadier drizzly rain moving in from the west, likely persistent rain into night.	
Cloud on the hills?	Low cloud gradually lifting and breaking	
	Fairly extensive across the hills in morning, bases 500-700m, or lower at first near coasts. Base gradually rising and breaks forming. Patches may come and go on highest tops into early afternoon, but increasingly clearing. Lowering by dusk.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	30% rising to 80%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sun, becoming increasingly sunny Visibility good below cloud, may become more widely very good afternoon.	
How Cold? (at 900m)	9C rising to 11C or slightly higher well inland afternoon.

Effect of wind on you?	Starting to affect balance and comfortable walking in places on exposed tops and ridges.	Affecting comfortable walking and balance on some higher exposed tops and ridges. Considerable wind chill.
How wet?	Rain then showers	Showers
(Precipitation and its impact)	Risk of fairly persistent rain from dawn into early morning, breaking up into showers, local heavy bursts into afternoon, these tending to move away eastwards.	Showery rain most frequent near north-facing coasts in the morning, some showers pushing increasingly inland, tending to fade with time.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive, lifting with some breaks	Covering tops, some improvement
	Covering the hills widely, lowest bases to mid-slopes near coast in morning. Bases rising to upper slopes, some breaks forming, but often capping higher tops; better later in day.	Covering higher areas fairly widely above 700-800m in morning, locally 600m or lower for a time toward north and near Llyn peninsula. Tending to rise and break toward upper slopes in afternoon, but patches may come and go high tops.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30%	40%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Brief bursts of sun developing. Visibility reduced in rain, becoming very good away from showers.	Glimpses of sun, most sun near coast in afternoon. Visibility becoming very good away from showers, slight coastal haze.
How Cold? (at 900m)	9 or 10C.	6C rising to 8 or 9C. Feeling below freezing in the wind, nearer -5C in morning higher tops.

#### **Planning Outlook**

#### All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 31 July, 2025

Westerly winds prevail in the extended outlook, with occasional fronts moving through - western mountains often shrouded in cloud, periods of rain and drizzle. Some showery bursts of rain further eastwards, particularly Thursday-Friday this week, but often smaller amounts of rain toward easternmost hills, and cloud bases often higher with breaks to eastern summits. Moderate breezes, sometimes more blustery - early next week looks windier for a time. Temperatures near average, though rather cool in Scotland late this week and again early next week. Ridges of higher pressure will build occasionally from the southwest for better windows of weather, particularly England & Wales.
