

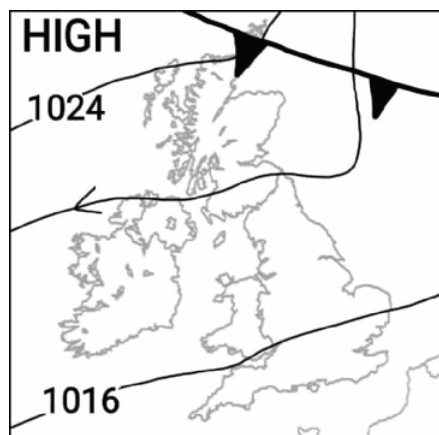
Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

General Summary for Tuesday, 19 August, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 19 August, 2025

A cooler feeling day with a rather gusty east to north-east airflow. An extensive cloud sheet, with local drizzle, covering many hills from dawn, but some westernmost hills still clear. Low cloud will burn back to eastern and northern hills, with sun most widely in the west, but low cloud persisting for parts of coastal western Scotland.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Breezy, feeling cooler. Cloud banks, mostly morning. Hazy sun best in the west.

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 19 August, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 15 to 20mph, but gusty 25-30mph around some higher tops and through elevated passes.
Effect of wind on you?	Noticeably breezy and feeling cool in exposure, gusts may affect comfortable walking and balance on ridges.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Some cloud in morning clearing Patchy cloud banks in the morning mostly Carneddau group around to east and mid-Wales, tending to lift above most tops, may come and go above 800m for a few hours. Very little toward west coast.
Chance of cloud free summits?	60% rising to 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Hazy sun best in west all day, occasional hazy sun breaking through in east. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 900m)	11 to 13C, then dropping towards 8C overnight.
Freezing Level	Above the summits
