

## General Summary for Tuesday, 19 August, 2025



## **British Mountain Summary:**

## Based on forecast chart for noon 19 August, 2025

A cooler feeling day with a rather gusty east to north-east airflow. An extensive cloud sheet, with local drizzle, covering many hills from dawn, but some westernmost hills still clear. Low cloud will burn back to eastern and northern hills, with sun most widely in the west, but low cloud persisting for parts of coastal western Scotland.

## Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Breezy, feeling cooler. Cloud banks, mostly morning. Hazy sun best in the west.

## **Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 19 August, 2025**

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 15 to 20mph, but gusty 25-30mph around some higher tops and through elevated passes.	
Effect of wind on you?	Noticeably breezy and feeling cool in exposure, gusts may affect comfortable walking and balance on ridges.	
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected	
Cloud on the hills?	Some cloud in morning clearing	
	Patchy cloud banks in the morning mostly Carneddau group around to east and mid-Wales, tending to lift above most tops, may come and go above 800m for a few hours. Very little toward west coast.	
Chance of cloud free summits?	60% rising to 90%	
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Hazy sun best in west all day, occasional hazy sun breaking through in east.  Visibility very good.	
How Cold? (at 900m)	11 to 13C, then dropping towards 8C overnight.

How windy? (On the summits)  Effect of wind on you?	Northeasterly 15-25mph, occasional stronger gusts over tops and elevated passes.  Fairly small, though buffeting gusts will blow over high terrain at times.	North-easterly 20 to 30mph in morning, occasionally higher in gusts, but hour by hour easing down to 15mph afternoon.  Blustery and gusty with marked wind chill in the morning. Becoming mostly small into the afternoon.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Increasingly clearing summits	Capping tops, mainly north of A5.
	From dawn, fairly extensive cloud above 700m, some banks drifting down east slopes near Carneddau/Tryfan. Cloud soon lifts to and above highest tops.	Within a north-easterly airflow, cloud will likely cap fairly extensively hills near and north of the A5 for several hours.  Elsewhere, occasional patches Snowdon.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30% rising to 90%	40% north, 70% south.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	From dawn, glimpses of sun, best in the west; becoming mostly sunny. Very good visibility, some haze east.	Intermittent sun near and north of A5. More frequently elsewhere. Visibility very good or excellent.
How Cold? (at 900m)	8 to 10C. Slopes towards mid-Wales locally warmer, up to 12C, particularly west.	7C at dawn, lifting to 11C
Freezing Level	Above the summits	Above the summits

## **Planning Outlook**

## All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 20 August, 2025

High pressure centred toward the northwest this week, before building overhead again toward weekend. East to northeasterly winds prevailing, gusty for periods, easing out later in week. Extensively dry with sunshine best in west, low cloud for periods northern and eastern mountains with occasional drizzle. Still very dry underfoot with significant fire risk. Turning cooler through midweek, mountain temperatures falling, chilly into the valleys and glens pre-dawn, risk slight frost in Highland glens. Fine weather likely next weekend too; will likely begin to break down from the west into the following week, but uncertainty on timings of such a transition.
