

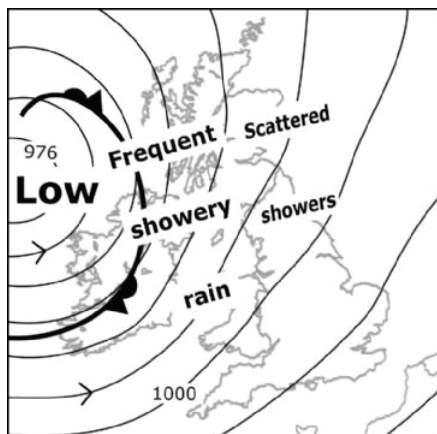

General Summary for Sunday, 31 August, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 31 August, 2025

Low pressure southwest of the Hebrides, brings strong to gale force southerly winds; marked chill. Showery rain frequent on western hills from west Highlands to Snowdonia, with showers increasingly developing elsewhere. Hill fog varied, but extensive west/southern Highlands. Highest cloud bases in northern Scotland.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Strong winds, gale force gusts. Frequent rain in the west. Cloud covering hills.

Detailed Forecast for Sunday, 31 August, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	South to southwesterly 40 to 50mph, risk 60mph at least in gusts for periods over higher mountains.
Effect of wind on you?	Arduous walking conditions widely, often difficult mobility on highest terrain, gusts could knock you over. Significant wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Frequent showery rain, some heavy Bursts of rain throughout the day, most frequent toward west coast early morning, but increasingly widespread. Risk of isolated thunder.
Cloud on the hills?	Most frequent western hills. Cloud base varying, often covering higher terrain above 800m, sometimes 600m toward coast, patches elsewhere in rain. Breaks occasionally higher up.
Chance of cloud free summits?	40% in west, 70% in east
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Brief glimpses of sun. Visibility good away from showers, but general haze.
How Cold? (at 900m)	8 or 9C, little change all day. Wind chill feeling below freezing, near -5C in exposure on highest summits.

	Monday 1 September	Tuesday 2 September
How windy? (On the summits)	South soon southwesterly, 30 to 40mph.	Southerly 10mph, may become variable in direction.
Effect of wind on you?	Frequent buffeting, strenuous walking over exposed high terrain, affecting balance on ridges. Considerable wind chill.	Small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Heavy showers, hail and thunder Showery rain throughout the day, merging into clusters of more constant rain at times. Heavy bursts with hail, risk of lightning.	A few showers, then later steadier rain. A few showers, may fade for a time, before risk of more persistent rain spreading up from the south.
Cloud on the hills?	Rarely above high tops Often covering higher slopes above 600-800m, most persistent west coastal areas, lowering in rain. Some breaks toward higher tops, but only briefly clearing.	Increasingly lowering onto hills in rain. Cloud likely varied at first, with ragged banks and patches on the hills. However, should persistent rain edge in, cloud would become more coherent on the hills.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%	40%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Rare brief glimpses of sun. Visibility intermittently good; but general haze, poor in rain.	Rather dull and overcast. Visibility good at first, but likely lowering from the south as rain moves in.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	8 or 9C. Feeling sub-zero directly in the wind on higher terrain. Above the summits	9C Above the summits

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Monday, 1 September, 2025

Low pressure continues to dominate early in the new week, maintaining unsettled conditions widely. Areas of rain and heavy showers, risk of hail and thunder. Windy, gales over mountains early in the week, tending to ease for periods at least in the Highlands mid-late week, whilst southwesterlies often remain strong over England and Wales. Some improvement possible toward next weekend, though the extended outlook into the second week of September remains changeable. Mid-September shows signs of a better improvement as pressure tends to rise more widely.
