

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# General Summary for Tuesday, 11 November, 2025



# British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 11 November, 2025

Rain from dawn in Wales soon spreads widely into England and southern Scotland, setting in for several hours; nearly constant all day for Lakeland and Galloway hills. Widespread gales as well, severe in Wales. A drier start for Scottish Highlands, though rain will spread from the south afternoon with strengthening wind.

Severe gales over the tops with frequent rainfall

# **Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 11 November, 2025**

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly, strengthening rapidly overnight up to dawn, 45 to 60mph all day, with gusts often reaching 70mph over western tops.		
Effect of wind on you?	Difficult walking conditions; any mobility challenging around western high tops.  Strong downslope gusts on northern aspects likely. Marked wind chill despite mild air.		
How wet?	Often raining, most persistent early and late		
(Precipitation and its impact)	Several hours of constant rain from dawn, heavy over western hills, breaking for several afternoon hours of lighter patchy rain and drizzle. Later, prolonged heavier rain setting in again onward into evening.		
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive, lowest southwest		
	Blanket low cloud across hills, to lower elevations near coasts in west. Mostly above 600m inland with some higher breaks north/east of the A5; some higher breaks are possible though ragged patches will cling to lower slopes.		
Chance of cloud free summits?	Below 10%		
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast and murky. Very poor visibility but better locally toward east if drier for a time.		
How Cold? (at 900m)	Rising from before dawn to 6C, soon up to 8C and remaining elevated through afternoon; only small fall with height. Feeling like -5C directly in the wind.

Cloud on the hills?	Fairly extensive, some breaks north	Mostly high tops and west slopes
	Banks of cloud from lower elevations upward in the morning, may linger particularly western hills. Breaks mostly Carneddau. Lowering widely in rain.	Fog will cling to the Snowdon summits and down to the middle slopes facing Cardigan Bay likely all day. Banks with higher bases will drift towards Carneddau and east Wales, at times clearer here, though may trend more variable later.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%	10%; 40% east Wales
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast, varied layers of cloud. Misty areas may linger, locally good visibility mainly toward north.	Patchy-to-frequent sunshine east Wales, little sun to the west. Visibility very good, though locally poor in rain.
How Cold? (at 900m)	8C. Feeling like 0C or below if in stronger wind.	7C; may lower towards 5C later in the day, detail uncertain. Feeling near or below freezing in wind.

# **Planning Outlook**

## All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 12 November, 2025

Periods of heavy rain for many over several day; further flooding for Wales, the Lakes and southwest Scotland. Cooler than recently in Scotland with freezing levels lowering to most high terrain, snow showers falling on high terrain from the north; remaining generally mild England and Wales by day and night.

Later in the week and into the weekend, high pressure draws colder air into Scotland and progressively further south into England and Wales over the weekend. Strong easterlies are likely over England and Wales and conditions will be largely dry with some clear hills and sunny bursts; overnight frosts likely widespread in Scotland. The weather regime the following week is uncertain but first indications suggest more unsettled weather.
