

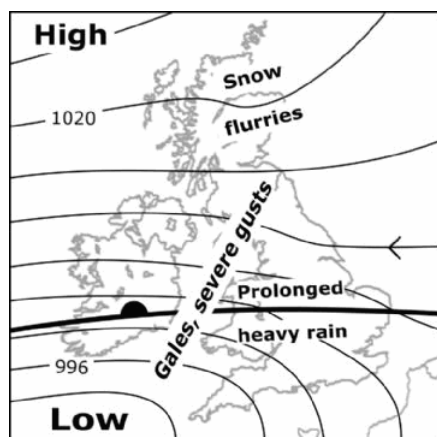

General Summary for Friday, 14 November, 2025



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 14 November, 2025

Cold across Scotland and northern England, below freezing on Scottish mountains all day. Snow flurries toward north/east Highlands. Significant chill factor from strengthening easterly winds, gale-force all day southern Scotland and northern England. Severe gales and incessant heavy rain Wales and Peak District.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Severe gales, constant rain, most intense east; significant flooding.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 14 November, 2025

How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly, 45 to 60mph, into afternoon 70mph, in places later reaching 80mph; ferocious gusts including passes and in places downslope to west of high terrain.
Effect of wind on you?	Increasingly severe conditions across the mountains, mobility widely difficult, gusts likely to knock you over, not just on highest terrain. Significant wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain all day, heaviest east, flooding A slow-moving extensive swathe of rain, heaviest sustained falls over eastern hills. Patchier northwestern areas early morning. Turning to sleet or wet snow higher tops. Saturated ground, expect flooding, becoming significant later.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive, lowest east Likely to cover the hills widely, lowest bases 400-500m eastern areas, mostly 600m further west, some local higher breaks toward west coast.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast and dull, murkier east. Visibility very poor due to rain.
How Cold? (at 900m)	2 or 3C, dropping to 1C later (small change with height above 700m). Wind chill feeling like -10 to -15C.
Freezing Level	Dropping close to freezing point over higher slopes as the day progresses.

	Saturday 15 November	Sunday 16 November
How windy? (On the summits)	Easterly 50mph from dawn, powerful gusts downslope to west; tending to ease during morning to 30mph.	East to northeasterly 20mph, to gusty 30mph in places around high tops and some passes, gusty downslope to west.
Effect of wind on you?	Difficult particularly at first, turbulent gusts on some slopes may continue all day, but tending to improve.	Blustery, some buffeting gusts in places, not just on highest terrain; considerable wind chill in exposure.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain fading out, flooding Continuing rain from overnight through dawn, but intensity easing and gradually becoming patchier during the day, leaving occasional mostly light rain afternoon. Considerable flooding expected.	Light showers A little rain in the wind at times, occasional light showery rain mostly Carneddau to areas near Bala, mainly morning.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive, highest breaks west Covering the hills widely, lowest bases in eastern areas around 500-600m, some breaks above 800m in west. May tend to lift gradually higher, best in west.	Areas of cloud tending to lift Banks of cloud drifting over slopes above 600 to 800m in the morning, lowest and most extensive in areas toward north and east. Tending to lift and break, western tops becoming often clear.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%	30% rising to 70%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast, some brighter skies may develop toward west coast. Hazy, visibility improving as rain eases.	Mostly cloudy, some sun may break through with time, mainly in west. Visibility tending to improve to be very good.
How Cold? (at 900m)	2C (little change with height above 700m). Wind chill feeling like -15C in exposure.	2 or 3C (small change of temperature with height above 700m). Feeling like -5 to -8C in exposure to wind.
Freezing Level	Just above freezing on some upper slopes.	Just above freezing on upper slopes.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 15 November, 2025

Colder air extends to all areas, staying below freezing over higher mountains most likely throughout the next week to 10 days. In the short-term, for Wales and south Pennines expect ongoing flooding from high rainfall on Friday, the rain eases into Saturday here. A lot of dry weather for Scotland this weekend, but some snow flurries move in from the north on Sunday. Areas of showery snow over the hills into next week coming in on often strong northerly winds, gale force into midweek. Snow most frequent toward north of the Highlands with some locally more substantial accumulations over higher terrain; some accumulating upland snow possible more widely during Tuesday as a front drifts southward.

Forecast issued at 15:01 on Thursday, 13 November, 2025
