


# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

## General Summary for Tuesday, 10 February, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 10 February, 2026

Windy and significant chill factor for the Highlands - murky and snow falling over the hills most persistent in eastern Scotland, rain below 600m. Better toward northwest, some cloud breaks toward coast. In northern England, lessening wind, patchy rain fading, low cloud rising higher. Drier until later for Wales.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Moderate breeze. Cloud base rising. Patchy rain at times.

## Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 10 February, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 20 or 25mph, increasing a little to 30mph at times later in day.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, but feeling more blustery in places later.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>A little rain early, risk rain again later west</b> Rain from overnight leaves patchy light rain after dawn, fading to become largely dry. During afternoon, patchy rain returns mainly onto areas nearer western coasts, risk later becoming more persistent.
Cloud on the hills?	<b>Most higher mountains persistently foggy</b> At first, persistent fog above 400 to 600m. Will tend to improve as breaks develop to 750 to occasionally 900m, temporarily clearing to highest tops. Lowering again later near west coast.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sunshine, mostly lower slopes north of Snowdon. Mostly very good visibility below cloud.
How Cold? (at 900m)	2C. Feeling like -5C or below later as wind increases.
Freezing Level	Just above highest summits.

## Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Wednesday 11 February	Thursday 12 February
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwest or westerly in the range 15 to 25mph, risk 30mph at times.	Low confidence in detail: generally westerly, 20-35mph, though lighter variable wind possible too.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>May impede ease of walking on higher areas, sometimes more strenuous with considerable wind chill.</b>	<b>In strongest wind, forward progress becomes arduous with wind chill, but conditions may substantially vary.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Intermittent rain</b> Showery rain from time to time. Hail and snow on higher summits.	<b>Often raining</b> Patchy rain affecting most mountains throughout the day with some extended rainy periods possible. Precipitation will fall as sleet/snow above 800m.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive, lowest west</b>  Most hills persistently cloud covered above 500 to 750m; perhaps breaks toward 900m east Wales.	<b>Mostly high terrain but highly variable</b>  Highest terrain stays shrouded most or all day, often above 800m. Cloud will variably lower to the middle slopes or locally the lower slopes, though also higher breaks are possible too.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Less than 10%</b>	<b>30%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Little or no sun. Extensively cloudy; visibility mostly good out of cloud, but poor in rain.	Some bright glimpses possible but often cloudy. Variable visibility, often poor in rain.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	0C. Wind chill feeling like -7 to -10C.	1C most of the day, lowering to 0C around dusk, dropping further overnight. Feeling as cold as -12C in direct wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	900m.	Just on highest summits most of the day, lowering to 700-800m into evening, further dropping overnight.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 11 February, 2026**

Becoming colder for all areas during this week, with much mountain terrain frozen again to increasingly lower elevations - soonest toward the north and east of Scotland. East to northeasterly winds in the second half of the week, turning northerly toward the weekend - the distribution of snow showers shifting with time from eastern hills to more north-facing mountains, particularly Scotland. Away from showers later in the week, brighter than recently with sunshine and clearer hills.
