

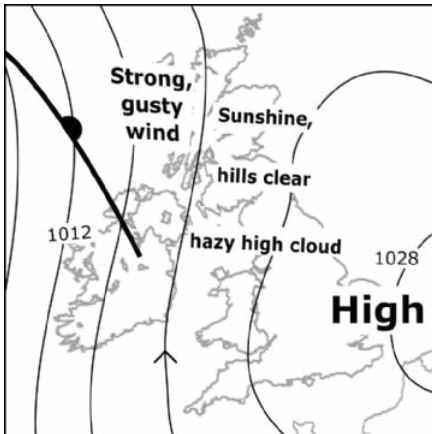
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

## General Summary for Monday, 6 April, 2026



**British Mountain Summary:**  
**Based on forecast chart for noon 6 April, 2026**

Gusty southerly winds, strongest on west coastal mountains in Scotland. A chilly start with frost, notably chilly at first in the Highlands, gradually warming up to rise above freezing later to all tops. Generally dry, with sun and a veil of high cloud, but most hills clear. A little rain may graze western Scotland later.

**Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park**

Gusty wind. Dry with sun, hills clear.

## Detailed Forecast for Monday, 6 April, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southerly 20 to 30mph, strongest on mountains nearest west coast.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Affecting ease of walking on some exposed terrain, gusty in places around higher western tops.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain unlikely</b> Very likely dry. Low chance of odd spots from thicker high cloud, mainly in west up to middle of day.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Mostly little</b> Patchy cloud over some western slopes for a time in the morning, but lifting and clearing.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine and a veil of high cloud. Visibility very good, slight haze may develop.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	0 or -1C from dawn, rising to 4C afternoon. Feeling like -7C directly in wind early in day, then -2C afternoon.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	800-900m at first, plus slight frost some valleys around dawn. Rising above freezing to highest tops by noon.

	<b>Tuesday 7 April</b>	<b>Wednesday 8 April</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Southeasterly 25 to 40mph, strongest gusts likely on some downslopes to northwest and through passes.  <b>Variable, in places fairly small, but sudden buffeting gusts affect comfortable walking and balance, not just on tops.</b>	Southwesterly 15 to 20mph, in places some gusts 25mph around high tops.  <b>Fairly small, but some occasional gusty spots feeling more blustery.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Rain not expected</b>	<b>Rain unlikely</b>  Most likely dry. Small chance of an isolated shower, mainly later in daytime.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Hills clear</b>  Patchy mist some valleys at first. The hills very likely clear all day.	<b>Patchy cloud, mostly little</b>  Mist in some valleys from dawn, possible patches of cloud around some hill slopes, largely dispersing. Some cloud banks may linger on west coastal hills.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Above 90%</b>	<b>80%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine and thin high cloud, gradually tending to thicken across the sky. Visibility good, but some haze.	Fairly cloudy, some sun may develop, then later high cloud builds toward west. Visibility good, some haze.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	10 to 13C, warm even from dawn above a marked temperature inversion.  Above the summits. Possible slight frost some sheltered inland valleys at dawn.	10 to 12C, warmer than valleys at first.  Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 7 April, 2026**

Quite warm by Tuesday, but strong to gale force southerly winds widely, very gusty in places, not just over the highest tops; dry for many, rain encroaching into western Scotland, thawing of recent snow. Staying warm on Wednesday for England & Wales at least, becoming cooler over western Scotland, then more widely cooler Thursday; milder by Friday, then likely chilly again by weekend - cooler spells will drop sub-zero on Scottish tops. A changeable mix of weather with some rain and showers with snow or hail on the hills, and often windy late week into the weekend in Scotland, whilst England & Wales will be generally drier and less windy in the outlook.
