

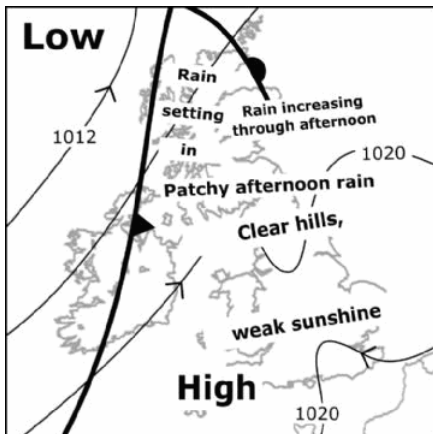
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Includes all summits in the the northern half of Wales from Pumlumon northwards.



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## General Summary for Saturday, 30 May, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 30 May, 2026**

Early patchy rain west Scotland, east hills dry and clear of cloud. Afternoon brings more substantial rain and cloud to west Scotland, spreading east with time; becoming blustery west too. Weak sun and clear hills England and Wales, mild-to-warm, notable breezes later for Eryri NP and Lakeland.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Sun through high cloud and mild; blustery into evening

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 30 May, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Southwesterly 10-15mph through morning, sometimes lower speeds. Strengthening afternoon, sustained speeds of 20-25mph by evening and gusting 30mph.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Small through morning, then increasingly affecting ease of walking, becoming strenuous on high terrain by evening and starting to feel chilly.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Rain unlikely until late</b> The hills likely stay dry until evening approaching when a few patches of rain may begin to drift in from the west, this continuing overnight.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Hills largely clear, odd patches west slopes</b> Some patchy cloud banks mostly hills near west coasts in morning, on middle or upper slopes, not necessarily over summits. Many hills start clear and early cloud likely substantially dissipates, only odd ragged patches west slopes if any.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>90%</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Mostly sunny, though weakened by a veil of high cloud, perhaps occasionally thickening. Very good visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	9 or 10C, coolest Yr Wyddfa and westward; may reach 11C Carneddau and Berwyn groups. Later feeling near 0C on tops in wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

## Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 31 May	Monday 1 June
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Westerly 15-25mph, gusts to 30mph.  <b>Beginning to affect ease of walking, more strenuous conditions at times over high summits with a chilly feeling.</b>	Southwesterly 20-30mph, likely gusty over tops and high passes, often to 35mph over Yr Wyddfa. Some risk of deteriorating.  <b>Walking impeded in exposure, buffeting gusts briefly affecting stability with a notable wind chill.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Light showers</b> Scattered showers drifting from the west, mostly light in nature, a lingering fine drizzle on high west slopes in the morning. An easing trend afternoon.	<b>Rain setting in</b> Patchy rain from before dawn becomes frequent through morning, likely setting in persistently by the afternoon, heavy falls to the south and west. North areas may see longer dry weather, though this is uncertain.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>  <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Lifting to just caps on high tops</b>  Fairly extensive above 600m early, to 300m west slopes of Yr Wyddfa and southward; nearer 700-800m Carneddau. Lifting and breaking, many hills clear by early afternoon, but a lingering bank of cloud over Snowdon and high west slopes.  <b>Rising to 70%</b>	<b>Fairly extensive</b>  From dawn, a deck of cloud shrouds western slopes from 400-500m up, locally lower; some higher breaks near Carneddau to start, possibly towards summits, but cloud fills in above 600m nearly all hills, always lowest bases west.  <b>10%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchy sunshine. Very good visibility but a building haze in the distance over the sea.	Overcast and largely dull, particularly afternoon. Visibility poor due to low cloud but good at low heights.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	8 or 9C.  Above the summits.	9 or 10C, little change with height; may rise a degree. Feeling near freezing in direct wind. Above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 31 May, 2026

Changeable southwesterlies prevail as the weekend transitions into next week. Sunday sees showers for west hill groups, more widely and sometimes heavy in Scotland. Monday brings more widespread rain and wind into England and Wales, showers continue in Scotland.

An unsettled theme is expected during the first ten days of June. Frontal systems from the Atlantic bring periods of rain, wind, and low cloud. Wind speeds will vary, but reaching gale force on mountains for periods, England and Wales looking particularly vulnerable. A few brighter windows, but these brief and often interrupted by afternoon showers with a risk of local thunder. Sometimes chilly in Scotland when the wind turns northwesterly though staying above freezing to summits.
