

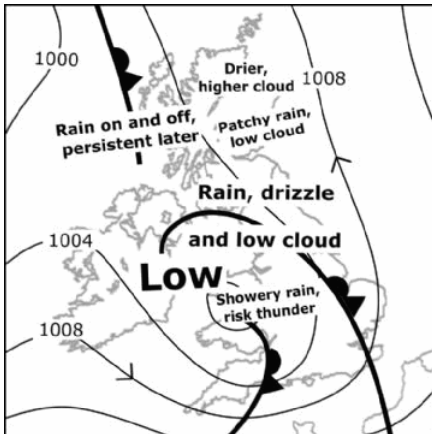
Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

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General Summary for Saturday, 6 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 6 June, 2026

Patchy rain toward the south of the Highlands, and tends to become more persistent west coasts. Varied low cloud, higher breaks generally north. A swathe of rain and low cloud northern England and southern Scotland. Clusters of showery rain for Wales, heavy bursts with local thunder. Wind speeds varying.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Windy, up to gale-force, brief lull. Showery bursts.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 6 June, 2026

<p>How windy? (On the summits)</p> <p>Effect of wind on you?</p>	<p>South-southeasterly 40-50mph at dawn, powerful gusts risk 60mph at first, easing through morning to 20mph or less around noon, then turning westerly afternoon, rising again to 35-50mph later in day, soonest mid-Wales.</p> <p>Strenuous walking, balance challenging in places early in day, feeling distinctly chilly in exposure; a marked improvement to be fairly small middle of day for a few hours, but then later deteriorating again.</p>
<p>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</p>	<p>Heavy rain at first, then heavy showery bursts passing east</p> <p>Rain fairly persistent from dawn, heavy in west for a couple of hours, fading to leave drizzly rain mid-morning, but then some further bursts of showery rain form, passing west to east into early afternoon, locally heavy, chance of isolated thunder. Tending to fade later, but leaving patchy light rain mainly western hills into evening.</p>
<p>Cloud on the hills?</p> <p>Chance of cloud free summits?</p>	<p>Fairly extensive</p> <p>Shrouding many hills much of day, especially more western areas, from low-mid slopes upward especially in rain, highest bases toward Carneddau if drier. A few fleeting breaks with higher bases here and there, more often late, but often covering western hills.</p> <p>20%</p>
<p>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</p>	<p>Overcast, mostly dull, poor visibility in rain, locally better if dry northern areas for a time; tending to improve below cloud later in west.</p>
<p>How Cold? (at 900m)</p> <p>Freezing Level</p>	<p>5C rising to 8 or 9C afternoon, then dropping again into evening. Feeling below freezing in the wind, around -5C early and late on high tops.</p> <p>Above the summits.</p>

	Sunday 7 June	Monday 8 June
How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly 30-40mph, strong gusts over tops to 45mph, possibly stronger.	Southwesterly 15 to 25mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Walking strenuous, including lower slopes early, and often arduous over tops with considerable wind chill.	Fairly small effect on walking, but feeling blustery and a noticeable chill on exposed high terrain.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Drizzly rain west, may deteriorate Some spotty rain drifting onto western slopes from time to time, perhaps a fine drizzle on high terrain in the early hours. Most areas substantially dry, but a risk of more frequent and heavier rain from mid-afternoon.	Rain then odd showers A band of rain clears eastward around dawn, briefly heavy. Then a scattering of showers, risk some more frequent in west later.
Cloud on the hills?	Clinging to high west slopes May be fairly extensive from middle slopes up in the morning, to the lower slopes west of high terrain. Lifting, likely largely above 700m, perhaps clearing summits of Berwyn group and Carneddau, but highest summits will struggle to clear.	Often capping western tops Varied cloud banks often over western tops above 800m, some lower patches in showers. Some breaks to tops more often north and east Carneddau to Bala.
Chance of cloud free summits?	30%	30%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Weak sunshine through high cloud, increasingly patchy with time. Good visibility though a haze over the sea.	Brief bursts of sun. Visibility good away from showers and below cloud.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7 or 8C, may rise to 9C Carneddau. Feeling near or below freezing in strongest wind.	4 or 5C. Feeling below freezing directly in the wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 7 June, 2026**

Generally unsettled next week - showers affect most hills Monday and Tuesday, lowest cloud and most persistent rain along western slopes, but with some breaks as well with sunshine. Risk of a deeper area of lower pressure from Wednesday or later bringing widespread strong winds, probably gales over many summits, with prolonged heavy rain. Temperatures trending milder again into next weekend, pressure may begin to rise in the south to give drier weather more widely with time.
