

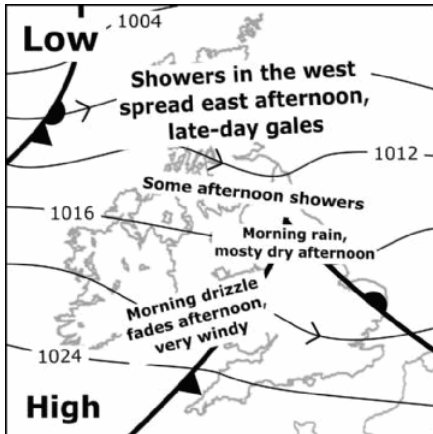
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

## General Summary for Friday, 12 June, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 12 June, 2026**

Strong wind for all. Showers and fog in west Scotland all day, passing east afternoon, persistent for a few later hours. Gales into Scotland from the west late afternoon into evening. Morning rain, drizzle, and fog in England, easing afternoon, driest S Pennines. Drizzle in Wales fades afternoon, sun glimpses break out.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Drizzle, slowly fading afternoon; windy, gale-force gusts

## Detailed Forecast for Friday, 12 June, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Westerly 30-40mph, notable gusts over high terrain much of the day, regularly to 45mph, or stronger early in the day.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Strenuous walking where exposed, buffeting gusts affecting balance on ridges, notably early when strongest gusts may knock you off balance. Feeling cool despite fairly mild air.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Drizzly rain, fading through afternoon</b> Damp over many western hills with drizzle often in the air, but may amount to little in total rainfall - some steadier light rain possible at times. Eastern hills drier, and the drizzle fading more widely as afternoon goes.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Extensive, lowest west, breaks forming afternoon</b> Persistent across the hills, foggy from lower elevations upward toward the west coast, cloud base rarely above 500m most western areas. Higher bases northeast of Ogwen and near Bala, but often shrouded above 600m; rising chance of breaks late in the day.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>10% rising to 30%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Largely cloudy, glimpses of sun mostly east Wales, and breaking into patchy sun through high banks of cloud through afternoon. Poor visibility, misty and hazy in west, locally better visibility below cloud in east.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	9 or 10C, little change during the day, but notably cooling overnight. Feeling like 0 to -3C where exposed to wind.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

	<b>Saturday 13 June</b>	<b>Sunday 14 June</b>
<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Northwesterly 25-30mph at dawn, easing to 20-25mph most of the day; risk stronger northernmost hills, gusty over  <b>Walking may be strenuous with buffeting gusts and wind chill early, easing to fairly small effects.</b>	Northwesterly 15mph at dawn, gusting 20-25mph over high tops and passes, easing and becoming variable, 10mph or  <b>Some notable gusts over high terrain just at and before dawn, but soon small.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Minimal patchy rain and drizzle</b> Damp with fine drizzle over the high tops with a few patches of rain drifting from the northwest from time to time. East Wales hills likely substantially dry, and any chance of rain reducing later.	<b>No rain expected</b>
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>  <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Lifting to high terrain</b>  Fairly extensive above 600-700m in the morning. A general lifting and breaking trend with time, though banks cling to terrain above 800-900m, and some variable lower banks on western slopes too.  <b>50%</b>	<b>Patchy banks on high slopes, most north</b>  Variable banks of cloud above the mid-slopes at dawn, some thin mist in sheltered valleys as well; many slopes start clear. Cloud will lift to largely above 800m, mostly dissipating, but clinging to northern slopes for longer; summits may be between cloud layers.  <b>Rising to 70%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Glimpses of sunshine, most often cloudy to the west. Good visibility, perhaps a light haze.	Sun increasingly breaks out but probably weakened by high cloud. Very good visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	6C rising to 10C. Feeling below freezing in early direct wind.  Above the summits.	7C rising to 13C.  Above the summits.

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 13 June, 2026**

Higher pressure to the southwest this weekend, bringing warmer and drier conditions to Wales. Showery rain affecting Scotland on Saturday, some patches reaching northwest England; staying very windy and cool in Scotland and northern England on Saturday too. Sunday will be a clearing day for most: early rain in Scottish Highlands easing and most cloud lifting off summits, sunshine but weakened by high cloud. Temperature more widely mild, warm in Wales.

Into next week, a mixed southwesterly pattern remains, windy at times with periods of rain, drizzle and low cloud most persistent in the west. Warmest in England and Wales, but cooler westerly air likely returns at times mid-late week.

Pressure generally trending higher, but extensively settled weather may remain elusive in the near-term.
