

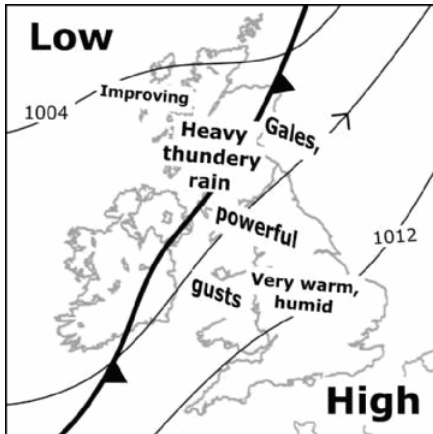

General Summary for Friday, 19 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary:
Based on forecast chart for noon 19 June, 2026

A swathe of heavy rain extends across the Highlands, southern Scotland then into Cumbria and west Wales, some torrential bursts, thunder and lightning possible. A belt of gale-force upland winds just ahead of the rain. Warm and humid. Winds ease in western Scotland, rain fades, cloud lifts, dropping cooler.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Gales, very gusty. Low cloud. Heavy thundery rain later.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 19 June, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	South-southwesterly, 40 to 50mph, some fluctuations throughout the day, peak gusts vary, 60mph for periods around high tops. Lessening into evening.
Effect of wind on you?	Challenging walking, gusts knocking you off balance, including on some downslopes to north. Considerable wind chill on tops despite warm air.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Thundery bursts developing later west Pulses of rain develop in west, occasionally moving inland, but mostly spots from high cloud until later. Substantially dry for much of day eastern areas. Increasing risk later afternoon into evening of heavy bursts of rain developing from west, risk torrential thunderstorms.
Cloud on the hills?	Varied, most persistent west coast Covering hills all day, persistent lowest slopes Lleyn peninsula to Snowdon. Elsewhere extensive above 450-600m but toward Berwyn mountains and near and north of A9 (mainly Carneddau), most cloud above 600 to 750m.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Less than 10%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensively dull and murky. Visibility may be good for a time inland, but a haze, then murkier around rain.
How Cold? (at 900m)	Humid 12 to 14C, tending to drop later in day, into night to 8C. Feeling near freezing in wind all day.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

	Saturday 20 June	Sunday 21 June
How windy? (On the summits) Effect of wind on you?	Southwesterly 15-20mph early in day, possibly 25mph around dawn; dropping variable 10mph or less. Mostly small.	East to southeasterly or variable, often 10mph or less, occasional gusts 15-20mph may develop. Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Early light showers fade Drizzly showers mostly west coastal hills early in day, fading to become dry.	Rain unlikely Chance of odd spots from thickening high cloud, possibly a very remote brief burst of rain mainly in afternoon.
Cloud on the hills?	Low cloud in west clearing Cloud banks on western hills in morning, to some lower slopes toward coast. Bases rising, tending to thin and break, but patches still likely to cap tops in Snowdon group into afternoon, increasingly clearing.	Hills clear
Chance of cloud free summits?	20% rising to 80% afternoon	Above 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Misty and largely cloudy start, improving with some sun breaking through and visibility becoming very good below cloud.	A mix of sun and some high cloud, which may cover the sky for periods. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	8C rising to 10C afternoon. Feeling near to 0C in wind on higher tops early morning. Above the summits.	12C at dawn, rising to 16C afternoon. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 20 June, 2026**

Cooler and less humid for Saturday, some showery rain and low cloud in the west, tending to improve. Sunday is a dry day for most with clearer hills, light winds and feeling warmer, becoming more humid again from the south. More uncertainty early next week - some rain possible for Scotland into Monday, potential scattered thunderstorms for England and Wales as it becomes very humid. A fresher westerly wind is indicated into Tuesday with some showers, then higher pressure likely expands over the country from the south midweek with drier weather then likely for a few days. Scope for higher temperatures and humidity to build toward next weekend, which may eventually break into thunderstorms.
