

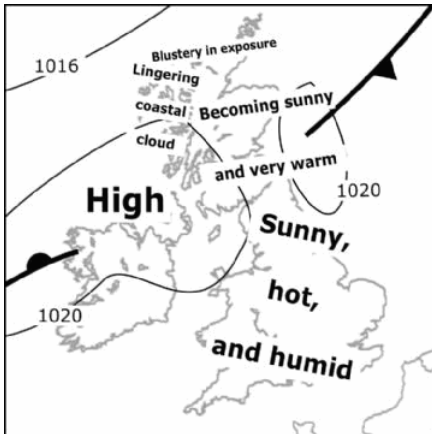
Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

General Summary for Wednesday, 24 June, 2026



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 24 June, 2026

Extensive hot sunshine and unusually humid - beware sunburn and dehydration. England and Wales as well as east Scotland see early low patchy fog clearing; highest tops of east Scotland may be at or above the cloud layer at dawn. Some cloud clings to Scotland's west coast, breezy over far northern tops.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Exceptionally hot and humid sun; some early coastal fog

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 24 June, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	From dawn, northerly 10mph, soon variable and less than 10mph most of the day. Orienting south-southeasterly overnight and slightly strengthening.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain
Cloud on the hills?	Little expected, may linger north for a time Some early fog patches in the valleys, an odd bank higher up, and perhaps a more extensive low cloud layer towards northern coastal slopes at dawn. Cloud soon lifts and largely dissipates after sunrise, though may linger for a few hours along northernmost slopes.
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sunshine, some thin high cloud around. May start hazy but visibility improves with time.
How Cold? (at 900m)	17 or 18C, rising to an exceptionally hot and humid 22 to 23C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.
