

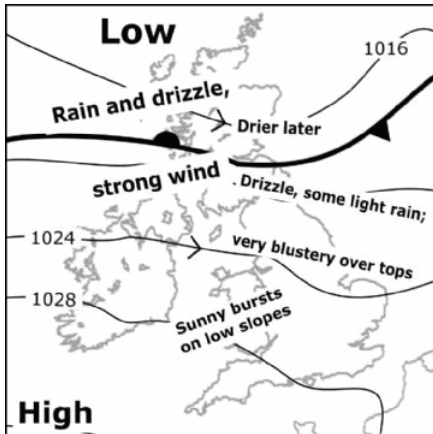
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Includes all summits in the the northern half of Wales from Pumlumon northwards.



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## General Summary for Saturday, 4 July, 2026



### British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 4 July, 2026

Rain sweeps east through Scotland, persistent for several hours; easing afternoon but staying drizzly and dull west. Mild but feeling chilly in strong wind. Lakeland and Pennines very windy and drizzly with hill cloud. Drier in Wales, sunny breaks on low slopes. Warm Wales and England though notable wind chill.

Cloud lifts to high terrain; blustery with buffeting

## Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 4 July, 2026

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b>	Westerly 25 to 35mph, stronger gusts may develop at times around higher mountains, and downslope to the east early. Highest sustained speeds over and north of Snowdon group.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Affecting comfortable walking and balance on higher tops and ridges, more frequent buffeting for periods highest areas, most strenuous conditions over northern hill groups with notable wind chill.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Fine drizzle high tops</b> Some drizzle in the air for periods, mostly western coastal hills and high tops, and amounting to very little. Little if any east Wales.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Lifting to higher terrain</b> Blanket cloud across hills toward west early, bases 500-600m or lower near coast, mostly above 600m further east. Bases lifting with breaks forming, tops of Berwyn group intermittently exposed. May occasionally break towards the Yr Wyddfa/Snowdon summit, but any clearing rare and brief.
<b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Rising to 40%, to 60% east Wales</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Largely cloudy and misty west Wales, sunny glimpses breaking out on eastern low slopes where visibility becomes very good.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	10C rising to 13C afternoon. Feeling like 2 to 4C directly in the wind on tops.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits.

<b>How windy? (On the summits)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Westerly 20-30mph, some variability, gusty over tops and passes. May ease somewhat. <b>Locally fairly small, but ease of walking becoming impacted on high exposed terrain, occasional buffeting gusts.</b>	Westerly 20-30mph, some variability and gusty over tops; a slight easing trend with time. <b>Locally fairly small, but ease of walking becoming impacted on high exposed terrain, some buffeting gusts.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Little or no rain</b> Some fine drizzle in the air over high terrain where in cloud, chance of a few early patches of light rain from the west in the morning, this all fading for a dry afternoon.	<b>Little rain expected</b> Some fine drizzle in the air over high terrain where in cloud, some light patches of rain coming from the west, but more often dry.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>  <b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>	<b>Lifting to upper slopes</b>  Fairly extensive high terrain with banks to at least middle slopes, patches to lower western slopes. Lifting trend with time to largely 800m and above, some breaks forming too, but caps return to the summits.  <b>Rising to 50%</b>	<b>Lifting to upper slopes</b>  Fairly extensive high terrain with banks to at least middle slopes, patches to lower western slopes; high summits may be near the top of the cloud layer. Lifting trend with time to largely 800m and above, some breaks forming too, most often broken east.  <b>40%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Increasingly sunny, particularly lower slopes, but weakened by high cloud; best sun east. Very good visibility.	Increasingly sunny on lower slopes but weakened by high cloud, best east. Very good visibility.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	10 or 11C, may rise slightly, up to 13C mid-Wales.  Above the summits.	10 or 11C, rising up to 13C.  Above the summits.

## Planning Outlook

### All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 5 July, 2026

Rain, drizzle and low cloud persist over western hills from Lake District northward through the weekend and into early next week. Temperatures near average, but feeling cool in exposure to wind on tops, quite strong and gusty in the north. Northeast areas are drier with higher cloud bases but patchy rain reaches here too. Higher pressure south maintains drier conditions in Wales and the south Pennines but cloud and some drizzle will affect high western slopes from time to time ; lighter wind here, but nuisance gusts in exposure. A drier and warmer window builds into the middle of next week: very warm in England and Wales, spells of sunshine spread northward, and lighter wind. Some showers and patchy rain continue through late week and next weekend, though detail is uncertain and more often dry.
