

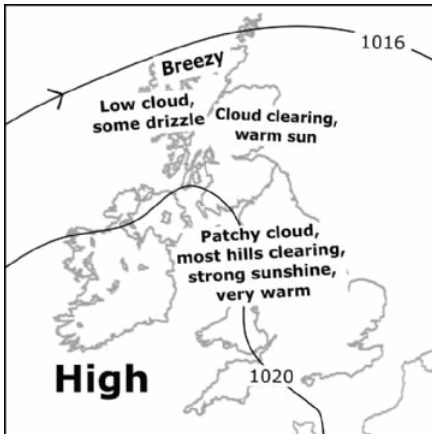

General Summary for Wednesday, 8 July, 2026



British Mountain Summary: Based on forecast chart for noon 8 July, 2026

Damp with blanket low cloud in W-NW Scotland, gusty locally. Highest Scottish tops may emerge above the cloud. Drizzle on western slopes easing, cloud thinning and breaking for central and southwest Scotland, sunnier and warmer overall in east. Very warm to hot sunshine for England & Wales.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Very warm and sunny. Light-moderate breeze.

Detailed Forecast for Wednesday, 8 July, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	West soon southwesterly 15mph to sometimes gusts 20mph around higher tops toward north/northwest of Eryri NP.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear Fragments of cloud on low-mid western hill slopes early morning, most hills clear. All dispersing. Odd pockets of sea mist near Llyn peninsula possible.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine and thin fair-weather cloud; high UV, beware sunburn. Visibility very good.
How Cold? (at 900m)	14C rising to 17C afternoon. (Inland valleys rising to around 25C, locally approaching 30C eastern mid-Wales).
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Eryri / Snowdonia National Park - Looking Ahead

	Thursday 9 July	Friday 10 July
How windy? (On the summits)	Variable direction 5 to 10mph.	Southeasterly or variable, 10-15mph or less.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.	Small.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	No rain expected	Most likely dry Late in the day, chance of a very isolated burst of rain, low risk a thundery downpour.
Cloud on the hills?	Hills clear Patchy mist inland valleys at dawn, local coastal fog, but the hills clear, in places overlooking lower fog over the sea.	Hills clear
Chance of cloud free summits?	Above 90%	Practically certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Generally sunny, thin high cloud. Visibility very good, some low-level haze, or possible fog near the coast.	Strong sunshine, some thin high cloud, may build across the sky later. Visibility good especially west, hazier eastwards.
How Cold? (at 900m)	15C rising to 19C afternoon.	18C at dawn, rising to 22C, very warm and rather humid especially in west. (Most valleys rising toward 30C afternoon)
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Thursday, 9 July, 2026**

Increasingly warm for Scotland, hot for England and Wales this week. Southwesterly winds easing for much of Scotland but remnants of fronts bring further low cloud and drizzle to the west late this week. Locally a chance of thundery downpours in eastern Highlands later Friday, some of which may linger into Saturday but likely fading. A generally fine summertime outlook through the weekend and well into next week as high pressure expands northwards to broadly reside across Britain. Warm but generally pleasant summer temperatures next week. Sunshine and fair-weather cloud, many hills often clear. Easterly breezes for England and Wales.
