

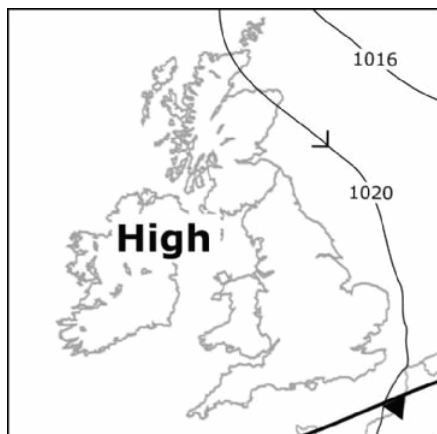

General Summary for Monday, 10 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 10 August, 2026

Windy in northern and western Scotland, particularly morning.
 Elsewhere, the breeze dropping away. Periods of bright sunshine, particularly England and Wales - beware sunburn.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Wind dropping. Bright sunshire.

Detailed Forecast for Monday, 10 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Northwesterly 15mph, dropping to very low speeds by afternoon.
Effect of wind on you?	Becoming negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Low risk isolated shower at first Possibly isolated brief showers Snowdon range until mid morning. - then dry.
Cloud on the hills?	Cloud confined above the summits by late morning Snowdon range: Cloud base rising through morning, soon to 800m and by late morning above 1000m. Will then all clear - probably Carneddau slowest to clear. Elsewhere, little if any.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost certain by midday
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sunshine - perhaps through areas of high level cloud and the Snowdon range may be intermittently cloudy (most likely morning). Excellent or superb visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	8C, rising to 13 to 17C, warmest well inland.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Cloud on the hills?	Very unlikely	Little if any
Chance of cloud free summits?	90%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	More or less unbroken sunshine. Excellent or superb visibility - haze may develop east Wales.	Extensive sunshine. Good visibility although a haze.
How Cold? (at 900m)	11C rising to 21C	14 rising to 21C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 11 August, 2026**

Chance of bursts of rain, possibly locally thundery on Wednesday NW England northwards, with further occasional rain (and low cloud) later in the week, mainly across the W & NW Highlands.
The almost completely dry and warm weather will persist elsewhere. Underfoot conditions will remain exceptionally dry.
There may well be little change in the pattern into next week.
