

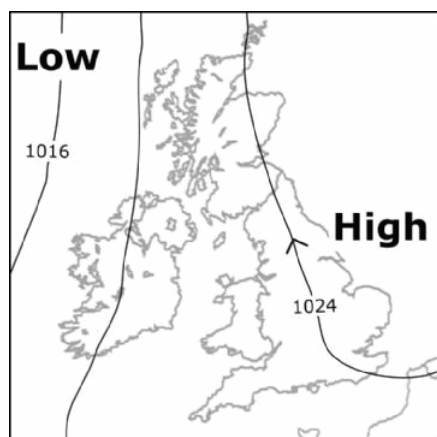

General Summary for Tuesday, 11 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 11 August, 2026

Fine and widely sunny - albeit patches of high thin cloud. In Scotland cloudy at times near west coast, whilst centred on the SE Highlands, persistent low cloud in the morning. Becoming very warm England and Wales.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Dry, warm and sunny.

Detailed Forecast for Tuesday, 11 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 10 or 15mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills?	Very unlikely
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost certain
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	More or less unbroken sunshine. Excellent or superb visibility - haze may develop east Wales.
How Cold? (at 900m)	11C rising to 21C
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

	Wednesday 12 August	Thursday 13 August
How windy? (On the summits)	Southerly 10-15mph.	Southerly between 15 and perhaps 20mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible	Small
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain very unlikely	Substantially or completely dry Here and there chance of a burst of rain - perhaps just a few spots, but possibly a heavy burst with a rumble of thunder.
Cloud on the hills?	Little if any	Little if any
Chance of cloud free summits?	Almost certain	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Extensive sunshine. Good visibility although a haze.	Periods of sunshine - sometimes through high level cloud. Hazy.
How Cold? (at 900m)	14 rising to 23C.	Reaching an unusually warm 22 to perhaps 27C - the highest temperatures on easternmost summits.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Wednesday, 12 August, 2026

Chance of bursts of rain, possibly locally thundery on Wednesday NW England northwards, with further occasional rain (and low cloud) later in the week, mainly across the W & NW Highlands.

The almost completely dry and warm weather will persist elsewhere - very hot indeed Thursday. Underfoot conditions will remain exceptionally dry.

There may be little change in the pattern into next week - although there is uncertainty in the track of oncoming rain on low cloud at the end of the weekend.
