

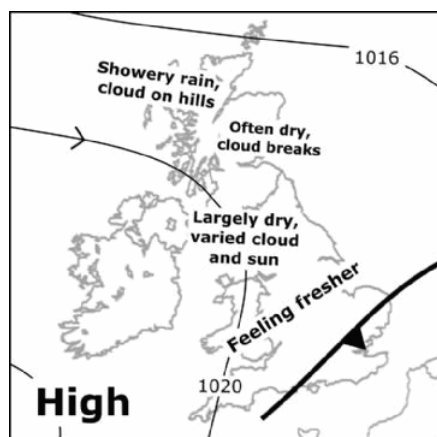
# Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

## General Summary for Saturday, 15 August, 2026



### British Mountain Summary:

#### Based on forecast chart for noon 15 August, 2026

A fresh-to-strong westerly breeze across Scotland brings showery rain frequently to the northwest, cloud covering many western hills; fewer showers and higher cloud bases eastward. Moderate northwesterly breezes for England & Wales, cooler than recent days, early showers mostly fade with cloud lifting.

### Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Breezy start lessens. Patchy early rain, cloud slowly lifts/breaks.

| <b>How windy? (On the summits)</b><br><br><b>Effect of wind on you?</b> | Northerly 20-25mph at dawn, strong gusts over high terrain and downslope southward; easing to 15-20mph into middle of day. Occasional 20-25mph westernmost tops later in day.<br><br><b>Blustery in exposure with considerable buffeting early, feeling rather cool, tending to ease towards fairly small effects.</b>                                                                              |
| <b>How wet?</b><br>(Precipitation and its impact)                       | <b>A little light rain, fading</b><br>From dawn to early morning, some spotty light rain drifts onto the hills from the north, drizzly on high terrain in cloud as well, fading out to leave dry conditions by middle of day onward.                                                                                                                                                                |
| <b>Cloud on the hills?</b><br><br><b>Chance of cloud free summits?</b>  | <b>Lifting to high summits, breaks afternoon</b><br>Fairly extensive early, particularly northwestern areas; some breaks at varied elevations south and east. Lifting through morning, to just banks over high terrain above 800-900m. Caps may come and go on highest tops nearer coasts into afternoon, but tending to lift and break; often clear sooner inland.<br><br><b>30% rising to 70%</b> |
| <b>Sunshine?</b><br>Air clarity (below cloud)                           | Cloudy start, some sun breaking through to leave a mix of fair-weather cloud and sun into afternoon; becoming sunnier coasts.<br>Very good visibility.                                                                                                                                                                                                                                              |
| <b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b><br><br><b>Freezing Level</b>                 | 9 or 10C.<br>Feeling like 2 to 5C in the wind, coldest early in day.<br><br>Above the summits.                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                                      |

**All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 16 August, 2026**

Westerly weather patterns prevail into the new week bringing generally unsettled and cooler conditions - single-figure temperatures typical on the Munros and high tops elsewhere. On Monday, extensive rain spreads across Scotland, heaviest in the west. Winds strengthen, risk reaching gale force on many hills later on Monday, staying blustery widely into midweek. Rain extends south over England and Wales by Monday night into early Tuesday. The rest of the week likely sees showery rain common for all areas as low pressure dominates toward the north, the rain most persistent in western Scotland, but odd heavier bursts passing eastward, with a chance of thunder, especially later in week.

Forecasts are issued daily by 16:30 and are kept under review and amended as necessary. However, expected conditions can still change after issue. © Copyright Mountain Weather Information Service, 2026.
