

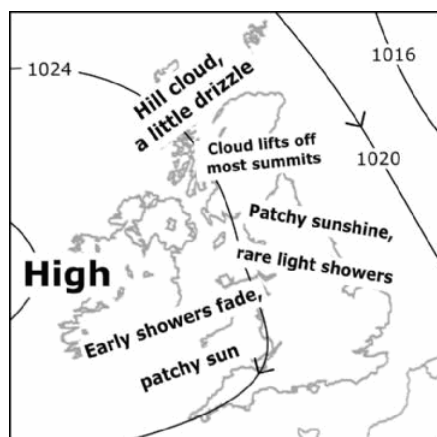

General Summary for Saturday, 22 August, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 22 August, 2026

Cloud clings to northwest Scotland slopes, a little drizzle. Cloud clears most other Munros, varied banks over highest summits. Rare showers in England but most hills dry, morning cloud lifting off summits with patchy sunshine. Early showers in north and west Wales will clear for patchy sun as well.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Early showers fade for patchy sun; varied cloud on highest tops

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 22 August, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	North-northwesterly 10-15mph, gusts beginning to form on high terrain.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small, some nuisance gusts over high tops.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Early showery rain fades Showery rain over the hills in the morning, a few local heavy bursts will come and go. Showers tending to break, hills becoming entirely dry with time.
Cloud on the hills?	Lifting to summits with breaks Fairly extensive over high terrain in the morning with lower patches, to lower northern slopes where sheltered. Cloud lifts to summit height, many summits clearing afternoon; highest summits to the north and Snowdon may be more regularly capped.
Chance of cloud free summits?	Rising to 60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of cloud and sun, cloud tending to fade later for a bright sunset. Excellent visibility.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7 to 9C, mildest to the south and east.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

	Sunday 23 August	Monday 24 August
How windy? (On the summits)	Variable mostly less than 10mph, some upslope breezes forming.	Southeasterly 10-25mph: trending from low to high speeds through the day, further rising overnight.
Effect of wind on you?	Negligible.	Mostly small, but the breeze notably picks up in exposure through the day.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Likely none A little fine drizzle in cloud on northern slopes in the early hours, otherwise dry.	No rain expected
Cloud on the hills?	Rising to high summits Banks at varied heights in the morning, including in valleys; clear windows between cloud layers (possibly clear summits). Cloud will lift towards summit height, many hills entirely clearing, but highest summits may be variably capped.	Little or none A little patchy mist on low slopes in the morning, soon lifting and dissipating for clear hills.
Chance of cloud free summits?	50%	90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Often sunny, some fair weather cloud around. Very good visibility.	Mostly sunny, some thin high cloud builds with time. Good visibility but some haze around.
How Cold? (at 900m)	7C rising to 10 to 12C, warmest towards mid-Wales.	10 to 12C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 23 August, 2026

A core of high pressure drifts over the country on Sunday, bringing light and varied wind, dry weather, and minimal hill cloud fairly widely. Northwest Scotland will see a westerly breeze with a little drizzle and lingering hill cloud. It will feel warm in England and Wales in the sunshine, but fair weather cloud will tend to build in the afternoon. Monday is settled too, but high pressure slips away to the northwest, facilitating a southeasterly wind into Wales, later more widely. Tuesday sees a return of low pressure from the south: temperatures will rise and patchy rain will increasingly spread northward with some local stronger wind. Conditions likely continue to unsettle as next weekend approaches with bands of heavy rain forming, varied conditions continuing through the weekend, and likely staying warm and somewhat humid.
