

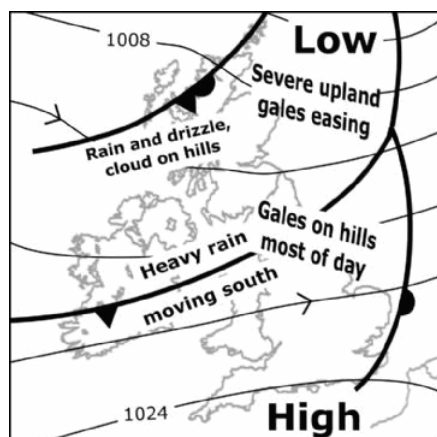
Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

General Summary for Saturday, 12 September, 2026



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 12 September, 2026

Severe gales from dawn on Scottish mountains ease during morning, moderate speeds by mid-afternoon, whilst gales continue on tops in England & Wales until later. An intense band of rain moves south, followed by still frequent rain, some showery bursts plus low cloud western hills. Drier later north Scotland.

Headline for Eryri / Snowdonia National Park

Gales on tops most of day. Rain sets in heavy.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 12 September, 2026

How windy? (On the summits)	Southwesterly, rising through dawn to 50mph, soon up to 60mph higher northern tops, lessening gradually afternoon to 40mph, then 30mph into evening.
Effect of wind on you?	Very difficult walking conditions with powerful gusts to low levels until later in daytime, on exposed terrain you may be blown over. Considerable wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Heavy rain develops, sets in, lasts until late in day Rain initially patchy, but soon more persistent northwestern Eryri in the morning, then more widely, heavier falls developing, setting in continuously through middle of day and afternoon, only fading from north during evening. Increasingly very wet underfoot, streams rising to be in spate later.
Cloud on the hills?	Increasingly extensive, lowest west Banks of low cloud over hills toward the west in the morning, some early breaks more north and eastern groups. Filling in and lowering widely in rain, to mid-slopes in west, highest bases remain further east.
Chance of cloud free summits?	20% becoming almost nil west
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Overcast, increasingly dull. Hazy, then widely poor visibility in rain.
How Cold? (at 900m)	10C rising to 12C, quite humid. Feeling like -2 to -5C directly in wind.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.
