

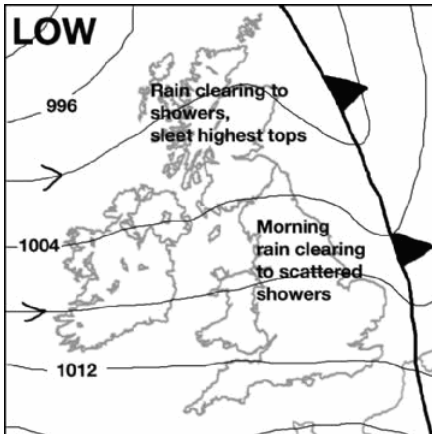
# Southeastern Highlands

## General Summary for Monday, 27 September, 2021



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 27 September, 2021**

Residual heavy rain and low cloud from overnight will clear east in morning. Chiller conditions follow to all areas with a gusty southwesterly wind and showers; most frequent across Wales and also western Scotland where they will fall as sleet on the highest munros.

### Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Heavy rain at first. Then mostly dry with tops clearing, but windy.

## Detailed Forecast for Monday, 27 September, 2021

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	West to southwesterly increasing through morning to 20mph by midday, then 25 to 35mph through the afternoon.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Increasingly blustery through afternoon with conditions fairly arduous with significant wind chill and buffeting.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Heavy rain clearing, then mostly dry</b> Wet start, as heavy rain from overnight lingers for a few hours after dawn. Then a drier afternoon follows with just the odd shower; mainly to the west of the A9.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Early banks clearing, then mostly clear.</b> Extensive low cloud at first, but soon dispersing to leave hills mostly clear, although occasional patches possible on tops.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>30% lifting to 70%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Cloudy start, but increasingly thinning to allow periods of sun into the afternoon. Visibility good or very good, but slight haze.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	3 to 5C
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Soon close to freezing highest tops.

## Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	<b>Tuesday 28 September</b>	<b>Wednesday 29 September</b>
<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	Southwesterly in the range 20 to 30mph, may ease during the afternoon.	Northwesterly 35 to 45mph at dawn, will ease to around 20-30mph into the afternoon.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Will likely impede walking across the hills for several hours with marked buffeting and wind chill.</b>	<b>Expect arduous conditions through morning with significant wind chill and buffeting; conditions slowly easing.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Occasional showers</b> A few showers will move in from the southwest through the day, sleet highest tops. Risk of showers merging to give steady rain later in the day.	<b>Isolated, if any, showers</b> Very likely dry much of the day. However, risk of the odd shower, these mostly occurring west of the A9.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Lowering onto tops for periods.</b>  Tops likely clearing at times, especially east of the A9, but periods where bases will lower down to 1000-1200m.	<b>Mostly clear</b>  A few patches covering higher tops at times in the morning. Otherwise, clear.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>50%</b>	<b>70%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional patches of sun, but mostly cloudy in the west.  Visibility good or very good.	Bursts of sunshine.  Visibility very good.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	3 to 5C	1 to 3C; coldest early morning.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Just above highest tops	1000m at first, lifting to around 1200m

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Tuesday, 28 September, 2021**

An unsettled and windy period of weather over the next 7 to 10 days with frequent areas of low pressure bringing bouts of upland gales or severe gales and rain; large falls accumulating across western hills. Chillier than of late, some days near freezing on higher Scottish tops with sleet and wet snow at times on the highest Munros.
