

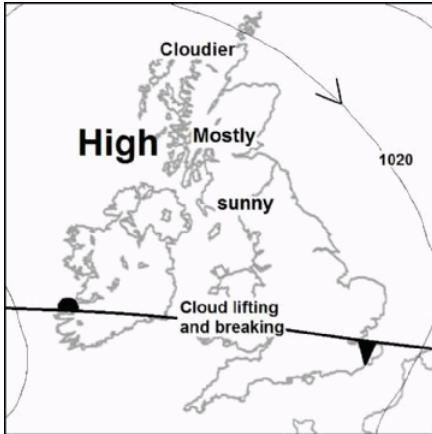
# Southeastern Highlands

## General Summary for Friday, 15 October, 2021



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 15 October, 2021**

A crisp autumn day with plenty of sunshine and light winds for many places. Frost at dawn, particularly Highland glens. Highest Scottish summits staying near or just below freezing all day. Remnants of a front brings mostly cloudy skies to mid & south Wales.

### Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Dry and sunny, chilly.

## Detailed Forecast for Friday, 15 October, 2021

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	West to northwest 5-10mph
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Negligible
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	No precipitation expected
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Very little or none</b> Rare if any fragments grazing the higher tops.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>Above 90%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Mostly sunny. Visibility excellent.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	0 to 2C. Will feel sub-zero despite only light winds on the tops.
<b>Freezing Level</b>	900-1100m, but also frost in glens and some corries early in morning.

## Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	<b>Saturday 16 October</b>	<b>Sunday 17 October</b>
<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b> <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Southwest turning southerly, 10-15mph or often less, may strengthen to 25mph into evening. <b>Mostly small</b>	Southwesterly 15 to 30mph. <b>Speeds may vary, but expect buffeting at times on higher tops, feeling cool where exposed.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Little or no rain through the day</b> Risk of small amounts of rain or drizzle encroaching from the southwest, mainly hills west of the A9. Into the night, rain becomes steadier and more widespread from the west.	<b>Little or no rain</b> Rain from overnight is likely to break up, leaving a generally dry day. Possible occasional spots of drizzle in the wind.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>  <b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>Varied, but may be very little</b>  Some patchy mist in glens from dawn and banks of cloud covering some higher tops for a time, but many hills should be often clear. Mainly western hills in Perthshire, some low cloud banks may linger.  <b>70%</b>	<b>Extensive</b>  Fairly extensive cloud throughout the day across the mountains, risk to lower slopes many areas in the morning and may persist above 600 to 800m, lowest near/west of the A9. Highest breaks hills around Loch Rannoch.  <b>20%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine most widely toward east, may give way to increasing cloud from west. Visibility very good some areas, but risk misty around the central belt in morning.	Mostly cloudy and dull, murky in the morning. Visibility may improve a little below cloud, best toward east.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	Starting around 0C, rising slowly to 3C by afternoon, then 5C into evening and night.  From dawn, sub-zero above 900 to 1100m, also frost in glens. Will gradually rise above freezing all levels.	7C  Above the summits

**Planning Outlook****All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 16 October, 2021**

A chilly start to the weekend, but milder air returns from the southwest to all regions by Sunday. Some rain, although a fair amount of dry weather too this weekend. An unsettled week ahead as low pressure moves in from the Atlantic accompanied by a series of frontal systems. Often windy, periods of gales or severe gales on the mountains. Rain heaviest and most persistent in western areas. Mild southwesterlies early in the week, then colder air returns from the northwest later in the week - temperatures falling below freezing on high tops with showers of snow. Changeable conditions are expected to continue into late October.

**Forecast issued at 16:30 on Thursday, 14 October, 2021**
