

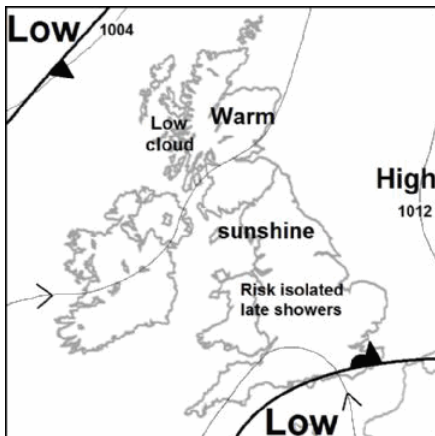
Southeastern Highlands

The southern highlands as far west as the central highlands and north to Ben Alder, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Thursday, 23 June, 2022



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 23 June, 2022

Warm and quite humid with strong sunshine for most areas. Light to moderate southerly winds. The west coast of Scotland will hold on to banks of low cloud, but some breaks forming. High cloud builds over Wales and central England, may locally result in a thunderstorm toward evening, drifting northwards.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Mostly dry. Low cloud west, lifting gradually, clearer east.

Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 23 June, 2022

How windy? (On the Munros)	South to southwesterly 15 to 25mph.
Effect of wind on you?	Fairly small, but blustery in places where exposed on higher mountains.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk isolated rain briefly Nearly all areas dry, although here and there, chance of a shower. Into night, chance of localised bursts of rain forming, possibly thundery.
Cloud on the hills?	Extensive for periods central highlands, but cloud base lifting; clearing afternoon. Patchy fog on lower slopes in morning. Cloud mostly across hills west of the A9 in the morning, base will lift to 650m, gradually thinning and breaking. Elsewhere, cloud mostly above 800m and likely to extensively clear completely.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	50% rising to 80%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sunshine mostly eastern areas, cloudier west of A9, but some sun breaking through. Visibility very good, but dull or misty for a time central highlands.
How Cold? (at 900m)	10 to 13C from dawn, rising toward 16C in places by afternoon.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Friday 24 June	Saturday 25 June
How windy? (On the Munros)	South to southeasterly or variable, 10 to 20mph or sometimes less.	South or southeasterly, speeds may vary considerably, sometimes little wind, up to gusty 30mph in places.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small, but sudden gusts may form around bursts of rain.	At times small, but expect periods of buffeting gusts on both higher and lower slopes.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Increasing risk thundery downpours Chance of bursts of rain locally from early morning, but forming increasingly as the day progresses. By afternoon into evening, areas of rain lasting an hour or more. Some heavy downpours, risk hail and thunder.	Risk early rain, heavy showers forming A possibility of rain early in the day for a few hours, mainly toward east. This clearing, then drier for a time, but showers forming, risk locally heavy for central highlands, with hail and isolated thunder.
Cloud on the hills?	Forming and lowering widely in rain Prior to rain, many hills clearing for periods, but some banks covering southern slopes. However, where rain develops, cloud lowering widely, to form extensively at various levels. May envelop many hills to lower slopes.	Forming and lowering in showers Mostly just patches on higher tops in the morning, which will lift and break. Then around showers, cloud will vary, filling in on some higher slopes, and cloud banks in places forming to lowest slopes if heavy downpours occur.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	50%	60%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun fairly weak due to layers of high cloud, becoming overcast. Visibility good, slight haze, reducing where rain develops and murky if it sets in.	Occasional sun breaking through. Visibility often very good, but reduced where rain occurs.
How Cold? (at 900m)	10C rising to 14C, feeling humid.	5C rising to 9C.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.	Above the summits.

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 24 June, 2022

Turning more unsettled for several days through the weekend into early next week as a slow-moving area of low pressure affects Britain. Conditions will vary day-to-day, locally escaping dry some days, but expect some areas of persistent rain mixed with heavy or sometimes thundery showers almost anywhere. Wind speed also varied, mostly south or southwesterly, strengthening at times, may reach gale force on the high tops into next week. Feeling warm where sunshine develops, but cool in cloud and rain. Cloud will come and go on the hills, but lowering extensively during rain.

Forecast issued at 16:30 on Wednesday, 22 June, 2022
