


Southeastern Highlands

The southern highlands as far west as the central highlands and north to Ben Alder, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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General Summary for Friday, 24 June, 2022



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 24 June, 2022

Localised showers in the morning, but many places will be dry for a few hours. Showers forming more widely by afternoon, some heavy with hail and thunder, but some places missing them completely. More constant rain moves into Wales later where southerly winds may touch gale force on tops. Quite warm and feeling humid.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Isolated heavy showers. Low cloud lifting.

Detailed Forecast for Friday, 24 June, 2022

How windy? (On the Munros)	South to southeasterly or variable, 10 to 20mph or sometimes less.
Effect of wind on you?	Mostly small, but sudden gusts may form around bursts of rain.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Showers forming, most widely by evening, chance of thunder. Chance of bursts of rain locally from early morning, but forming mostly during afternoon. These quite localised and many places may stay often dry. By evening however, risk areas of rain lasting an hour or more. Scattered heavy downpours, risk hail and thunder.
Cloud on the hills?	Lifting toward or above tops Fairly extensive cloud banks from dawn, covering some hills to low elevations, but will lift and break during the morning, leaving mostly just patches around high tops. Where showers occur, cloud banks then lowering back onto the hills.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	30% rising to 70% by late morning.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Sun fairly weak due to layers of high cloud, becoming overcast for periods. Visibility good, slight haze, reducing where rain develops.
How Cold? (at 900m)	10C rising to 14C, feeling humid.
Freezing Level	Above the summits.

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Saturday 25 June	Sunday 26 June
How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	South or southeasterly, speeds varied, sometimes 10-15mph or less, but in places up to gusty 30mph. At times small, but expect periods of buffeting gusts on both higher and lower slopes.	Southeasterly, 25 to 40mph, risk gusts over 50mph at times. Blustery all day, but sometimes walking will be arduous, perhaps difficult on higher tops. Considerable wind chill.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Risk heavy showers forming A possibility of rain around dawn, but clearing northwards, then drier for several hours, but showers forming, risk locally heavy for central highlands by afternoon, with hail and isolated thunder.	Showery Bursts of rain on and off, risk merging to become more constant rain for periods during the day.
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Varied, breaks for a time Banks of cloud on the hills from dawn into morning, which will lift and break. Then around showers, cloud will vary, filling in on some higher slopes, and cloud banks in places forming to lowest slopes if heavy downpours occur. 60%	Fairly extensive, lowering in rain Cloud bases varied, but often shrouding most higher mountains. Will lower extensively if rain sets in, with patches from lower slopes upward. 30%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Occasional sun breaking through. Visibility often very good, but reduced where rain occurs.	Glimpses of sun, but mostly cloudy. Visibility sometimes good, but reduced around rain, occasionally poor.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	5C rising to 9C. Above the summits.	6 to 9C. Above the summits.

Planning Outlook**All mountain areas of Britain from Saturday, 25 June, 2022**

Unsettled for several days through the weekend into early next week as a slow-moving area of low pressure affects Britain. Conditions will vary day-to-day, locally escaping dry some days, but expect some areas of persistent rain mixed with heavy or sometimes thundery showers almost anywhere. Wind speed also varied, mostly south or southwesterly, strengthening at times, may reach gale force on the high tops into next week. Feeling warm where sunshine develops, but cool in cloud and rain. Cloud will come and go on the hills, but lowering extensively during rain.

Forecast issued at 16:39 on Thursday, 23 June, 2022
