


Southeastern Highlands

The southern highlands as far west as the central highlands and north to Ben Alder, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.

General Summary for Saturday, 6 August, 2022



British Mountain Summary:

Based on forecast chart for noon 6 August, 2022

A warm front passes eastwards across Scotland, bringing cloud, some rain or drizzle. The northwest stays damp, but areas toward central Scotland will become brighter. Thickening cloud over hills of northern England and a little drizzle. Dry and fairly sunny for Wales.

Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Breezy, quite cool. Low cloud, patchy drizzle, better afternoon.

Detailed Forecast for Saturday, 6 August, 2022

How windy? (On the Munros)	West to southwesterly, in the range 15 to 25mph, from late afternoon into evening sometimes reaching 30-35mph on higher summits.
Effect of wind on you?	Walking impeded for periods where exposed on higher terrain, buffeting in places. Becoming arduous at times later. Feeling cool on tops.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Drizzly rain moving east, fading afternoon Spots of rain from high cloud or drizzly showers, mainly hills west of the A9 at first, passing eastwards during the morning then fading through middle of the day to leave a largely dry afternoon and evening.
Cloud on the hills?	Covering higher slopes for periods, lowest and most extensive morning. Varied cloud extent, some hills clear from dawn, particularly east. Lowering cloud in morning, filling in to lower slopes for a time, particularly near central lowlands. Most cloud above 700-900m toward Pitlochry, often above 900m east from Glenshee, lower in rain. Bases then lifting, but likely to come and go on higher areas west of A9.
Chance of cloud free Munros?	20% west, 50% east.
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Fairly cloudy overall, glimpses of sun best toward the central lowlands and Angus. Visibility good below cloud, but hazy or misty for a while around drizzle.
How Cold? (at 900m)	5C rising to 9C, feeling cooler in wind. (Note: Small change with height at first, some glens cooler at dawn).
Freezing Level	Above the summits

Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead

	Sunday 7 August	Monday 8 August
How windy? (On the Munros) Effect of wind on you?	Westerly, 15 to 20mph, occasionally 25-30mph on higher summits, possibly stronger just around dawn. Fairly small, but may impede walking at times on higher areas, perhaps very blustery for a time.	Southwesterly, 15 to 20mph, sometimes 25mph higher Munros. Fairly small, but breezy around some higher tops, may impede walking on exposed ridges.
How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)	Rain unlikely Rare if any drizzly showers, mainly west of the A9.	Rain not expected
Cloud on the hills? Chance of cloud free Munros?	Most extensive morning, lowest west Banks of cloud confined to higher slopes mostly west of the A9. May come and go above 500-800m around the Trossachs for several hours. Toward east, tops more often clear from mid-morning. 30% west, 70% east.	Mostly clear Patchy mist or fragments of cloud around some slopes in the morning, but soon all dispersing. 90%
Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)	Fairly cloudy, but occasional sun, best toward and east of Glenshee. Visibility good or very good.	Sunshine may weaken as thin high cloud spills in from west, plus a little fair-weather cloud building. Visibility excellent.
How Cold? (at 900m) Freezing Level	9 to 12C, little change during day, warmest toward east, locally warmer some slopes by afternoon. Above the summits	9 to 12C, warmest east from Glenshee. Above the summits

Planning Outlook

All mountain areas of Britain from Sunday, 7 August, 2022

Southwesterly winds continue to influence Scotland into next week. Rain or drizzle will be most frequent in the Northwest Highlands, where low cloud will often shroud coastal hills. Winds strengthening at times toward gale force on the tops. Further south and east across Scotland, it will be commonly dry with higher cloud bases, becoming warmer and more humid with time. High pressure extends across England and Wales, leading to a settled outlook for the week ahead here, generally dry with light winds, becoming increasingly warm or very warm, particularly in southern areas.

Forecast issued at 16:30 on Friday, 5 August, 2022
