

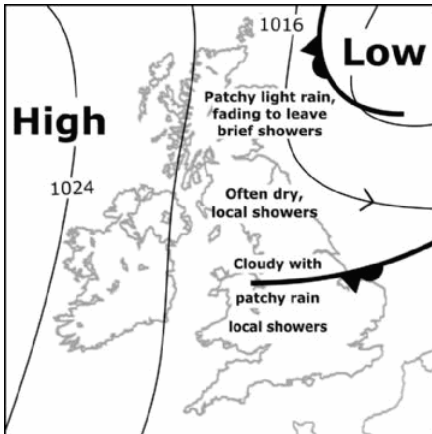
# Southeastern Highlands

The southern Highlands as far west as the Callander area and north to Ben Alder, Drumochter and summits near Glenshee ski-centre (summits within the historic county of Perthshire). Also Ochils and Angus hills.



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## General Summary for Thursday, 11 July, 2024



### British Mountain Summary:

**Based on forecast chart for noon 11 July, 2024**

Extensive cloud, more frequent rain in the morning on Snowdon range and in the Cairngorms. Sunny spells likeliest on the western Scottish coast. where cloud may lift during the day above most hills, leaving highest Munros in clouds. Windy on the eastern Highlands. Mostly cool temperatures.

### Headline for Southeastern Highlands

Windy with morning rain, improving, later some sun south

## Detailed Forecast for Thursday, 11 July, 2024

<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>	Northerly 15 to 30mph, strongest toward the east on higher tops. Gusts exceeding 40mph locally possible.
<b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	<b>Small on lower elevations, on exposed tops east of A9 blustery, buffeting affects balance and stability.</b>
<b>How wet? (Precipitation and its impact)</b>	<b>Light rain morning east</b> Light rain here and there in the morning, a few brief showers in the afternoon. Generally low risk of rain toward Ben Alder, there mostly dry already in the morning.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>	<b>Hills widely clearing by early afternoon</b> Cloud base rising through morning, by the middle of day, initially west of A9, nearly all cloud above 1000m, perhaps then clearing highest tops.
<b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>Rising to 80% by mid afternoon</b>
<b>Sunshine? Air clarity (below cloud)</b>	Mostly cloudy only occasional sun. Visibility excellent.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>	6 to 9C, feeling close too freezing if exposed to wind
<b>Freezing Level</b>	Above the summits

**Southeastern Highlands - Looking Ahead**

	<b>Friday 12 July</b>	<b>Saturday 13 July</b>
<b>How windy? (On the Munros)</b>  <b>Effect of wind on you?</b>	Northerly, 10-15mph, at times 20mph, up to locally 25mph on easternmost tops.  <b>Fairly small, fresh breeze may make walking slightly inconvenient in the east at times. Feeling chilly for July on high tops.</b>	Northerly, mostly 20-25mph, weaker toward Ben Alder. Risk gusts over 40mph on easternmost hills.  <b>Mostly small, may become blustery and affect comfortable walking in the east afternoon.</b>
<b>How wet?</b> (Precipitation and its impact)	<b>Mostly dry</b> Chance of an odd shower in afternoon toward Lochnagar.	<b>Risk showers afternoon, but most day dry</b> High uncertainty. Most probable scenario is dry most of the day, and locally in the east showers afternoon, but chance for more widespread showers late afternoon.
<b>Cloud on the hills?</b>          <b>Chance of cloud free Munros?</b>	<b>Hills clear</b>  Except for morning mist hills largely clear.          <b>90%</b>	<b>Hills mostly clear</b>  Except for some morning mist largely clear. Low cloud longer to clear toward Lochnagar, but peaks there should also clear by noon.          <b>70%</b>
<b>Sunshine?</b> Air clarity (below cloud)	Patchwork of sun, best in morning, cloud filling in a little.  Very good visibility.	Broken sun in the south, overcast north and on Cairngorm Plateau.  Poor visibility, improving south.
<b>How Cold? (at 900m)</b>  <b>Freezing Level</b>	8C, rising to 10C east, or 12C in central highlands by afternoon. In the breeze will feel close to freezing.  Above the summits	10C  Above the summits

**Planning Outlook**

**All mountain areas of Britain from Friday, 12 July, 2024**

Extensively dry over the next few days, although with one or two 'shallow' areas of low pressure close to Britain, rain is likely for a few hours in some areas - or sometimes afternoon heavy showers. Generally winds light; some sunshine, but overall fairly extensive cloud. A little less cold.
